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House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to reevaluate the requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act and to fund the levels authorized in the act.

7 WHEREAS, Florida led the nation in school reform when, in 8 1990, the Legislature passed what was popularly known as 9 "Blueprint 2000," a system of school reform and accountability, 10 and

WHEREAS, Blueprint 2000 called for the establishment of goals for K-12 education, high standards of achievement, development of a curriculum based on the standards, and an assessment system to ensure student learning progress and school accountability, and

WHEREAS, Florida has witnessed tremendous educational gains among its students as a result of the efforts of its students, teachers, parents, schools, and communities as an outcome of the implementation of the school reform and accountability system, and

WHEREAS, in 2001, the Congress of the United States 21 enacted, and President Bush later signed into law, the "No Child 22 Left Behind Act of 2001," an act designed to ensure the 23 24 accountability of America's schools for the academic success of 25 our students, especially those from minority groups, those with 26 disabilities, and those with limited English proficiency, and 27 WHEREAS, the No Child Left Behind Act represents one of the most sweeping federal intrusions into state and local control of 28 education and disregards the time-honored American principle of 29 Page 1 of 3

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30 balanced federalism and respect for state and local 31 prerogatives, especially in education, and WHEREAS, the No Child Left Behind Act mandates that all 32 33 schools attain adequate yearly progress toward the goal of 100 percent student proficiency in reading, math, language arts, and 34 35 science by the 2013-2014 school year, and 36 WHEREAS, most of the schools deemed as performing well under Florida's system of school accountability were determined 37 38 to be deficient under the No Child Left Behind Act, and 39 WHEREAS, the No Child Left Behind Act has been determined to be a tremendous unfunded mandate during a time of economic 40 challenges in the state and funding cutbacks in public education 41 42 budgets, NOW, THEREFORE, 43 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 44 45 46 That the Congress of the United States is requested to hold 47 harmless those states that, as a result of their own educational accountability systems, meet or exceed the requirements of the 48 49 No Child Left Behind Act. 50 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if a state is not held 51 harmless, the Congress of the United States is requested to provide federal funding in amounts consistent with the levels 52 53 authorized in the No Child Left Behind Act for education 54 programs and expanded information systems needed to accurately 55 reflect student, school, and school district performance and 56 professional development training necessary for teachers. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Congress of the United 57 States is requested to authorize appropriate methods of 58 Page 2 of 3

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assessment for students who are not proficient in English andstudents with disabilities.

61 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Congress of the United 62 States is requested to allow an alternative methodology for 63 determining adequate yearly progress targets and progress of 64 students who are not proficient in English and students with 65 disabilities.

66 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Congress of the United 67 States is requested to allow flexibility in calculating adequate 68 yearly progress for students belonging to multiple groups and 69 subgroups.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Congress of the United States is requested to recognize, through law and revisions thereto, that our federal system of government education is primarily a state and local responsibility.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.

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
