An ordinance granting additional homestead exemption 25 (4)26 as authorized by this section must meet the following 27 requirements:

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(c) It must specify the amount of the exemption, which may not exceed \$50,000 \$25,000. If the county or municipality specifies a different exemption amount for dependent special districts or municipal service taxing units, the exemption amount must be uniform in all dependent special districts or municipal service taxing units within the county or municipality.

Section 2. For the 2007 tax roll only, a taxing authority
that has adopted an exemption under section 196.075, Florida
Statutes, for the 2007 tax year may increase the amount of that
exemption, subject to the \$50,000 limit, by delivering to the
property appraiser by May 1, 2007, a copy of the adopted
ordinance authorizing the increase.
