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An act relating to the Florida African-American Culture and Heritage Initiative; creating s. 267.175, F.S.; creating the Florida African-American Culture and Heritage Initiative Commission within the Department of State for certain purposes; providing for commission membership; providing for terms of members; providing for successor appointment; providing for election of officers; requiring the commission to adopt bylaws; providing for commission meetings; specifying serving without compensation; providing for per diem and travel expenses; requiring the commission to develop a plan for certain purposes; requiring a report to the Governor and the Legislature; providing responsibilities of the department; authorizing the appointment of committees and subcommittees; requiring the commission to provide advice and assistance to the department regarding plan implementation and activities of a citizen support organization; describing the Florida African-American Culture and Heritage Initiative; specifying duties and goals of the initiative; authorizing the department to enter into contracts or accept loans or grants for money, property, or personal services to implement requirements; providing for the establishment of a citizen support organization for certain purposes; providing for legislative budget request; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 267.175, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

267.175 Florida African-American Culture and Heritage
Initiative Commission.--

- (1) CREATION.--The Florida African-American Culture and Heritage Initiative Commission is created within the Department of State for the purposes of:
- (a) Broadening, deepening, and diversifying statewide participation in and appreciation of African-American arts, history, and culture;
- (b) Assisting educational institutions with incorporating African-American history and culture in the curriculum in accordance with state law; and
- (c) Fulfilling other duties and goals provided in the description of the Florida African-American Culture and Heritage Initiative in subsection (7).
- (2) MEMBERSHIP.--The commission shall consist of the following members:
 - (a) Eleven members appointed as follows:
- 1. Seven members appointed by, and serving at the pleasure of, the Governor.
- 2. Two members appointed by, and serving at the pleasure of, the President of the Senate.
- 3. Two members appointed by, and serving at the pleasure of, the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

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Appointees shall be representatives of the general public who

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represent a broad cross-section of the views and interests of the community and the member organizations of the commission, including educators, clergy, and civic and business leaders; philanthropists; visual, creative, and performing artists; representatives of African-American arts, history, and cultural organizations; and persons having knowledge of, expertise in, or commitment to preserving the state's African-American culture and heritage.

- (b) The Secretary of State or his or her designee.
- (c) The Commissioner of Education or his or her designee.
- (d) The executive director of the Office of Tourism,

 Trade, and Economic Development.
 - (e) The chair of the Florida Historical Commission.
 - (f) The chair of the Florida Arts Council.
- (g) The chair of the Board of Directors of Visit Florida or his or her designee.
- (3) TERMS; VACANCIES.--Each appointed member shall serve a term of 4 years and shall be eligible for reappointment. If a position becomes vacant, a successor shall be appointed in the manner of the original appointment for such position.
 - (4) OFFICERS; BYLAWS; MEETINGS.--
- (a) The commission shall elect from among its members a chair, a vice chair, and such other officers as the commission deems necessary or expedient in the performance of its duties.

 Election of officers shall occur at the first meeting of the commission and every 4 years thereafter or sooner if a vacancy occurs.
 - (b) A majority of the total membership shall constitute a

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quorum. No vacancy in the membership shall impair the right of a quorum to exercise all of the functions and duties of the commission. All action taken by the commission shall be by majority vote of those members present.

- (c) The commission shall adopt bylaws for the conduct of its business and shall have the power to amend and rescind its bylaws. The commission shall publish its bylaws in convenient form and shall file with the Department of State a copy of such bylaws and a copy of any amendment to such bylaws.
- (d) The initial meeting of the commission shall be held no later than October 1, 2007. Subsequent meetings shall be held upon the call of the chair or vice chair, acting in the absence of the chair, and in accordance with the commission's bylaws.
- (e) Records and meetings of the commission shall be subject to the provisions of chapters 119 and 286.
- (5) REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.--Members shall serve without compensation, except that members are entitled to per diem and travel expenses pursuant to s. 112.061, incurred in the performance of their duties.
 - (6) DUTIES.--

(a) The commission shall develop a statewide plan for implementation of the initiative. The plan shall be developed to encourage and support participation in development of the plan and in its implementation by all interested groups throughout the state. The commission shall work with representatives from the state's tourism industries, cultural and historical venues, entertainment industry, K-20 educational institutions, local governments, state and federal agencies, and others as necessary

in the preparation and implementation of the plan.

- (b) The commission shall submit the initial plan to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than January 1, 2009. An updated plan shall be presented no later than January 1 of each succeeding year.
- (c) The commission shall be responsible for providing such other assistance and advice to the department as may be required from time to time in matters pertaining to the implementation of the Florida African-American Culture and Heritage Initiative, including, but not limited to, activities of the citizen support organization created by this section for the purpose of raising funds and assisting in the development and implementation of the initiative.
- (7) FLORIDA AFRICAN-AMERICAN CULTURE AND HERITAGE
 INITIATIVE.--The Florida African-American Culture and Heritage
 Initiative shall be an alliance of organizations and
 institutions that comprise the African-American arts, history,
 and culture communities in this state for the purposes of the
 commission. The duties and goals of the initiative shall
 include, but not be limited to, the following:
- (a) Promoting understanding and appreciation of the history and artistic and cultural contributions of people of African descent;
- (b) Providing guidance, support, and resources for new and emerging African-American arts and historical groups and increasing the level of organizational capacity and program administration of established groups;

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(c) Increasing funding and audiences for local African-American culture and heritage tourism and enriching African-American culture and heritage tourism programming;

- (d) Increasing and attracting corporate sponsorship and participation in African-American culture and heritage programming and tourism;
- (e) Increasing opportunities for young people to learn about and experience African-American arts, history, and culture in schools and youth organizations;
- (f) Investing in future generations of African-American artists and historians by providing leadership development activities, apprenticeships, mentorship, scholarships, and cultural programs;
- (g) Enhancing computer and Internet access and usage within the African-American community; and
- (h) Ensuring the financial viability of the initiative through a network of community partners, advocates, and supporters, including, but not limited to celebrities, philanthropists, public officials, state and local leaders, and corporations.
 - (8) RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE. --
- (a) Subject to appropriation, the department shall provide administrative support and consulting services to the commission for the commission's activities and duties as provided in this section.
- (b) The Secretary of State may appoint subcommittees or advisory committees as requested by the commission, which may include persons who are not members of the commission. Such

persons shall not be entitled to compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

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- (c) The Department of State may enter into contracts with, or accept loans or grants of money, property, or personal services from, any agency, corporation, or person to carry out the requirements of this section.
- The Division of Historical Resources of the Department of State may support the establishment of a citizen support organization pursuant to s. 267.17 to assist the commission in carrying out the purposes of the commission and in attaining the goals of the initiative. The citizen support organization may receive funds from the general public or other public or private sources for the purpose of funding its activities and implementing the provisions of this section. In addition to funds received from the general public or other public and private sources, the organization may receive funds from state agencies at such times and in such amounts as may be appropriated by the Legislature. All funds received by the citizen support organization other than those necessary to pay the expenses of the commission shall be used exclusively for the establishment, support, and promotion of the Florida African-American Culture and Heritage Initiative.
- 2. Costs to underwrite activities related to the commission administration and the activities of the commission to address its purposes outlined in this section may be borne from revenues raised by the citizen support organization.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
