Effective January 1, 2009, paragraph (a) of 11 subsection (1) of section 316.613, Florida Statutes, is amended 12 to read: 13 316.613 Child restraint requirements.--14 Every operator of a motor vehicle as defined 15 (1)(a) 16 herein, while transporting a child in a motor vehicle operated on the roadways, streets, or highways of this state, shall, if 17 the child is 7 5 years of age or younger, provide for protection 18 19 of the child by properly using a crash-tested, federally approved child restraint device that is appropriate for the 20 21 height and weight of the child. Such devices may include a 22 vehicle manufacturer's integrated child seat, a separate child safety seat, or a child booster seat that displays the child's 23 24 weight and height specifications for the seat on the attached manufacturer's label as required by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety 25 Standards FMVSS213. The device must comply with standards of the 26 United States Department of Transportation and be secured in the 27 vehicle in accordance with instructions of the manufacturer. For 28

29 children aged through 3 years, such restraint device must be a 30 separate carrier or a vehicle manufacturer's integrated child 31 seat. For children aged 4 through 7 $\frac{5}{5}$ years, a separate carrier, an integrated child seat, or a child booster seat belt may be 32 used. The court shall dismiss the charge against a motor vehicle 33 operator for a first violation of this paragraph upon proof of 34 35 purchase of a federally approved child restraint device. Effective July 1, 2008, a driver of a motor 36 Section 2. 37 vehicle who does not violate the then-existing provisions of section 316.613(1)(a), Florida Statutes, but whose conduct would 38 violate that provision as amended January 1, 2009, may be issued 39 a verbal warning and given educational literature by a law 40 enforcement officer. 41 42 Section 3. This act does not apply to a person who is 43 transporting a child aged 4 through 7 if the person is: 44 (1) Visiting in this state; (2) Transporting the child gratuitously and in good faith 45 in response to a declared emergency situation or an immediate 46 47 emergency involving the child; or Is acting generally as a Good Samaritan. 48 (3) 49 Section 4. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2007. 50
