A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Construction Education Scholarship Program; creating s. 1009.5383, F.S.; creating the scholarship program to award scholarships to eligible students who enroll in construction-related postsecondary education programs; requiring the Department of Education to administer the scholarship program; creating the Construction Education Scholarship Board to assist in the establishment and implementation of the scholarship program; providing student eligibility criteria; providing requirements for issuance and disbursement of awards; requiring annual financial audits; providing for legislative appropriation and deposit in the State Student Financial Assistance Trust Fund; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1009.5383, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

created to establish a scholarship program to reward any eligible Florida high school graduate who enrolls in a construction-related degree program, certificate program, or applied technology program at an eligible Florida public or

(2) The Department of Education shall administer the

Construction Education Scholarship Program according to rules
and procedures established by the Construction Education

Scholarship Board. The department must advertise the
availability of the scholarship program and notify students,
teachers, parents, guidance counselors, and principals or other
relevant school administrators of the student eligibility
criteria and application procedures. The department must begin
the process of notification no later than January 1 annually.

- (3) (a) The Construction Education Scholarship Board is created as a 12-member board to assist the department in the establishment and implementation of the scholarship program.
- (b) The Commissioner of Education shall appoint four members to the board. Each member appointed by the commissioner must be an educator from a union or nonunion construction apprenticeship program or vocational, community college, college, or university construction program and shall represent the construction education industry.
- (c) The President of the Senate shall appoint three members who represent the construction industry and one member who represents the general public.
- (d) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint three members who represent the construction industry and one member who represents the general public.
- (e) Board members shall serve 4-year terms. However, for the purpose of providing staggered terms, of the initial appointments, the Commissioner of Education, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives

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shall each appoint two members for 2-year terms, one member for a 3-year term, and one member for a 4-year term. Any vacancy on the board shall be filled by the original appointing authority.

- (f) Any member who fails to attend three consecutive board meetings without good cause may be removed from the board by the board secretary.
- (4) Student eligibility criteria established by the board shall include, but not be limited to:
- (a) An interest in developing a career in the construction industry.
- (b) Current or previous membership in one or more high school sponsored clubs that promote construction, leadership, or good citizenship.
- (c) A clearly demonstrated record of acceptable student behavior as defined by the board.
- (5) The program shall provide scholarships to students for the following types of construction education or training and related activities through an application process administered by the department:
  - (a) Union and nonunion apprenticeship programs.
  - (b) Vocational programs.
  - (c) Community college programs.
  - (d) College programs.

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- (e) University programs.
- (f) Other education or training programs deemed appropriate by the board.
- (6)(a) The department shall annually issue awards through the scholarship program. Annual awards may be for up to 45

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semester credit hours or the equivalent per term. Before the registration period each semester or term, the department shall transmit payment for each award to the president or director of the educational institution, or his or her representative, except that the department may withhold payment if the receiving institution fails to report or to make refunds to the department as required in this section.

- (b) Within 30 days after the end of regular registration each semester or term, the educational institution shall certify to the department the eligibility status of each student who receives an award. After the end of the drop and add period, an institution is not required to reevaluate or revise a student's eligibility status but must make a refund to the department if a student who receives an award disbursement terminates enrollment for any reason during an academic term and a refund is permitted by the institution's refund policy.
- (c) An institution that receives funds through the scholarship program shall certify to the department the amount of funds disbursed to each student and shall remit to the department any undisbursed advances within 60 days after the end of regular registration.
- (d) An institution that receives funds through the scholarship program shall prepare an annual report that includes an annual financial audit conducted by an independent certified public accountant or the Auditor General. The report shall include an audit of the institution's administration of the scholarship program and a complete accounting of the funds for the program. The report must be submitted to the department and

the board by March 1. The department may conduct its own annual audit of an institution's administration of the scholarship program. The department may request a refund of any funds overpaid to the institution for the scholarship program, which amount must be remitted within 60 days after such request. The department may suspend or revoke an institution's eligibility to receive future funds for the scholarship program if the department finds that an institution has not complied with this section.

- (7) Awards shall be in an amount determined by the board, not to exceed \$1,500 per semester or the equivalent per term.
- (8) If a recipient transfers from one eligible institution to another and continues to meet eligibility requirements, the award must be transferred with the student.
- (9) Funds appropriated by the Legislature for the Construction Education Scholarship Program shall be deposited in the State Student Financial Assistance Trust Fund, which funds shall be expended annually by the department in implementing the scholarship program. The department may recover only its direct expenses incurred in administering the scholarship program.

  Notwithstanding s. 216.301 and pursuant to s. 216.351, any balance in the trust fund at the end of any fiscal year that has been allocated to the Construction Education Scholarship Program shall remain therein and be available for carrying out the purposes of this section.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
