All public K-20 education classes shall be available 31 (C) to all students without regard to race, ethnicity, national 32 origin, gender, sexual orientation, disability, or marital 33 status; however, this is not intended to eliminate the provision 34 of programs designed to meet the needs of students with limited 35 proficiency in English, gifted students, or students with 36 37 disabilities or programs tailored to students with specialized talents or skills. 38

(e) Guidance services, counseling services, and financial assistance services in the state public K-20 education system shall be available to students equally. Guidance and counseling services, materials, and promotional events shall stress access to academic and career opportunities for students without regard to race, ethnicity, national origin, gender, <u>sexual orientation</u>, disability, or marital status.

Educational institutions within the state public K-20 46 (4)47 education system shall develop and implement methods and strategies to increase the participation of students of a 48 49 particular race, ethnicity, national origin, gender, sexual 50 orientation, disability, or marital status in programs and courses in which students of that particular race, ethnicity, 51 national origin, gender, sexual orientation, disability, or 52 53 marital status have been traditionally underrepresented, including, but not limited to, mathematics, science, computer 54 technology, electronics, communications technology, engineering, 55 and career education. 56

(7) NONDISCRIMINATION.--All education programs, activities, and opportunities offered by public educational institutions must be made available without discrimination on the basis of race, ethnicity, national origin, gender, <u>sexual</u> <u>orientation,</u> disability, or marital status, in accordance with the provisions of s. 1000.05.
