Governor's approval, and assure that approved policies and any 22 revisions thereto are properly executed. 23 Periodically review the status of the state 24 2. 25 transportation system including highway, transit, rail, seaport, intermodal development, and aviation components of the system 26 and recommend improvements therein to the Governor and the 27 Legislature. 28

Perform an in-depth evaluation of the annual department 30 budget request, the Florida Transportation Plan, and the 31 tentative work program for compliance with all applicable laws 32 and established departmental policies. Except as specifically provided in s. 339.135(4)(c)2., (d), and (f), the commission may 33 not consider individual construction projects, but shall 34 35 consider methods of accomplishing the goals of the department in the most effective, efficient, and businesslike manner. 36

4. Monitor the financial status of the department on a
regular basis to assure that the department is managing revenue
and bond proceeds responsibly and in accordance with law and
established policy.

5. Monitor on at least a quarterly basis, the efficiency,
productivity, and management of the department, using
performance and production standards developed by the commission
pursuant to s. 334.045.

6. Perform an in-depth evaluation of the factors causing
disruption of project schedules in the adopted work program and
recommend to the Legislature and the Governor methods to
eliminate or reduce the disruptive effects of these factors.

49 Recommend to the Governor and the Legislature 7. 50 improvements to the department's organization in order to streamline and optimize the efficiency of the department. In 51 reviewing the department's organization, the commission shall 52 determine if the current district organizational structure is 53 responsive to Florida's changing economic and demographic 54 development patterns. The initial report by the commission must 55 be delivered to the Governor and Legislature by December 15, 56

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2000, and each year thereafter, as appropriate. The commission
may retain such experts as are reasonably necessary to

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The commission shall appoint an executive director and

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85 assistant executive director, who shall serve under the 86 direction, supervision, and control of the commission. The 87 executive director, with the consent of the commission, shall employ such staff as are necessary to perform adequately the 88 89 functions of the commission, within budgetary limitations. All 90 employees of the commission are exempt from part II of chapter 91 110 and shall serve at the pleasure of the commission. The salaries and benefits of all employees of the commission, except 92 for the executive director, shall be set in accordance with the 93 94 Selected Exempt Service; provided, however, the salary and 95 benefits of the executive director shall be set in accordance with the Senior Management Service. that The commission shall 96 have complete authority for fixing the salary of the executive 97 98 director and assistant executive director.
