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7	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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9	Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 626.9913, Florida
10	Statutes, is amended to read:
11	626.9913 Viatical settlement provider license continuance;

13	(2) Annually, on or before March 1, the viatical
14	settlement provider licensee shall file a statement containing
15	information the commission requires and shall pay to the office
16	a license fee in the amount of \$500. After December 31, 2007,
17	the annual statement shall include an annual audited financial
18	statement of the viatical settlement provider statements
19	prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting
20	principles by an independent certified public accountant
21	covering a 12-month period ending on a day falling during as of
22	the last day of the preceding calendar year. If the audited
23	financial statement has not been completed, however, the
24	licensee shall include in its annual statement an unaudited
25	financial statement for the preceding calendar year and an
26	affidavit from an officer of the licensee stating that the audit
27	has not been completed. In this event, the licensee shall submit
28	the audited statement on or before June 1. The annual statement,
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29 due on or before March 1 each year, shall also provide the 30 office with a report of all life expectancy providers who have provided life expectancies directly or indirectly to the 31 32 viatical settlement provider for use in connection with a viatical settlement contract or a viatical settlement 33 investment. A viatical settlement provider shall include in all 34 35 statements filed with the office all information requested by the office regarding a related provider trust established by the 36 37 viatical settlement provider. The office may require more frequent reporting. Failure to timely file the annual statement 38 or the audited financial statement or to timely pay the license 39 fee is grounds for immediate suspension of the license. The 40 commission may by rule require all or part of the statements or 41 42 filings required under this section to be submitted by 43 electronic means in a computer-readable form compatible with the 44 electronic data format specified by the commission.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.

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
