2007 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to public records; amending s. 267.1736, 3 F.S.; providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain donor and prospective donor 4 information involving state-owned properties in a historic 5 district in the City of St. Augustine; providing for 6 7 future legislative review and repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of 8 9 public necessity; providing a contingent effective date. 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 11 12 Subsection (9) is added to section 267.1736, Section 1. 13 Florida Statutes, as created by HB 851, 2007 Regular Session, to 14 15 read: 16 267.1736 Direct-support organization.--(9) (a) The identity of a donor or prospective donor to the 17 direct-support organization who desires to remain anonymous, and 18 19 all information identifying such donor or prospective donor, is 20 confidential and exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) and 21 s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution; and that anonymity 22 must be maintained in the auditor's report. The university and the Auditor General shall have access to all records of the 23 24 direct-support organization upon request. 25 (b) This subsection is subject to the Open Government 26 Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2012, unless reviewed and saved from 27 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 28

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29 The Legislature finds a public necessity in Section 2. 30 protecting the identity of donors and prospective donors to the direct-support organization authorized to assist the University 31 32 of Florida in carrying out its dual historic preservation and historic preservation education purposes and responsibilities 33 for the various state-owned properties within the historic 34 35 district currently subleased by the Department of State to the City of St. Augustine for management. This protection will 36 37 enable the direct-support organization to effectively and efficiently administer the promotion, preservation, and public 38 39 education efforts related to these state-owned properties. The purpose of the exemption is to honor the request for anonymity 40 41 of donors or prospective donors to the not-for-profit 42 corporation and thereby encourage donations from individuals and entities that might otherwise decline to contribute. Without the 43 44 exemption, potential donors may be dissuaded from contributing to the direct-support organization because such donors fear 45 being harmed by the release of sensitive financial information. 46 47 Difficulty in soliciting donations would hamper the ability of 48 the direct-support organization to carry out its marketing, 49 promotion, education, and preservation activities and would 50 hinder fulfillment of the goal of the state in maintaining these state-owned properties and in preserving, promoting, and 51 advancing historic preservation of these properties through 52 funding by both the public sector and the private sector. 53 This act shall take effect on the same date 54 Section 3. 55 that HB 851 or similar legislation takes effect, if such

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56 legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an 57 extension thereof and becomes law.

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
