HR 9011

House Resolution

A resolution recognizing March 13, 2007, as "Chronic Kidney Disease Awareness Day" in Florida.

5 WHEREAS, more than 20 million Americans, about one in nine 6 adults, suffer from a form of chronic kidney disease and, of 7 these, more than 8 million have significantly reduced kidney function that, if left untreated, may progress to the more 8 severe stage of chronic kidney disease known as end-stage renal 9 10 disease, and

WHEREAS, chronic kidney disease and end-stage renal disease 11 12 affect approximately 400,000 Americans of which nearly 19,000 13 are Floridians, and

WHEREAS, the only treatment options for patients suffering 14 from end-stage renal disease are kidney transplantation and 15 16 dialysis and, because kidney transplantation is limited due to the severe shortage of donor organs, most end-stage renal 17 disease patients require 4-hour dialysis treatment three times 18 19 per week, and

WHEREAS, end-stage renal disease patients also suffer from 20 multiple co-morbid conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, 21 heart disease, anemia, bone disease, and malnutrition and 22 23 therefore require a regimen of medication therapy, dietary restrictions, and laboratory testing provided at their primary 24 point of care, a dialysis facility, in order to maintain their 25 26 lives, and

WHEREAS, the multidisciplinary care provided at a dialysis 27 28 facility to patients suffering from end-stage renal disease has

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29 resulted in significant improvements in patient outcomes and has 30 enhanced the quality of life for this patient population, and WHEREAS, most end-stage renal disease patients rely 31 32 primarily on Medicare and Medicaid to cover the costs of their 33 life-sustaining care, which includes dialysis treatment, 34 medications, laboratory testing, and, as necessary, transportation services to a dialysis facility, NOW, THEREFORE, 35 36 37 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida: 38 39 40 That March 13, 2007, is recognized as "Chronic Kidney 41 Disease Awareness Day" in Florida in the hope that all possible 42 support will continue to be extended to end-stage renal disease

patients in Florida, the country, and the world.

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
