10 WHEREAS, nearly 6 weeks after its founding, the first 11 public act of the sorority was its participation in the Women's 12 Suffrage March which demanded voting rights for women in 13 America, and

14 WHEREAS, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, is a 15 sisterhood of college-educated women committed to implementing 16 the sorority's mission through its Five-Point Programmatic 17 Thrust of Economic Development, Educational Development, 18 International Awareness and Involvement, Physical and Mental 19 Health, and Political Awareness and Involvement, and

20 WHEREAS, on January 13, 2007, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, 21 Incorporated, celebrated 94 years of exemplary service and 22 support to local communities, leading dialogue on public policy 23 issues, supporting quality education, and producing new projects 24 to stimulate current and future economic growth, and

25 WHEREAS, the membership of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority,
26 Incorporated, consists of more than 200,000 college-educated
27 women nationally and 950 chapters worldwide, including 47
28 chapters located in Florida and the Bahamas, the women of which
