19	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

21	Section 1. Section 287.048, Florida Statutes, is
22	created to read:
23	287.048 Procurement of environmentally preferable
24	cleaning products
25	(1) For the purposes of this section, the term
26	"environmentally preferable cleaning products" means cleaning
27	products that have a lesser or reduced effect on human health
28	and the environment than competing cleaning products that
29	serve the same purpose.
30	(2)(a) The department, in cooperation with the
31	Department of Environmental Protection, shall review and

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1	revise statewide procurement procedures and specifications for
2	the purchase of cleaning products to eliminate any procedures
3	and specifications that explicitly discriminate against
4	cleaning products that are environmentally preferable, unless
5	such procedures and specifications are necessary to protect
6	the public health, safety, and welfare.
7	(b) Each agency shall review and revise its
8	procurement procedures and specifications for the purchase of
9	cleaning products to eliminate any procedures and
10	specifications that explicitly discriminate against cleaning
11	products that are environmentally preferable, unless such
12	procedures and specifications are necessary to protect the
13	public health, safety, and welfare.
14	(3)(a) The department and each agency shall review its
15	procurement provisions and specifications for the purchase of
16	cleaning products to determine which environmentally
17	preferable cleaning products could be procured by the
18	department and agencies. In making such determination, the
19	department and each agency shall refer to the guidelines for
20	environmentally preferable purchasing set forth by the United
21	States Environmental Protection Agency.
22	(b) The department and each state agency shall review
23	and revise its procurement procedures and specifications for
24	the purchase of cleaning products to ensure, to the maximum
25	extent feasible, that each agency uses state contracts to
26	purchase environmentally preferable cleaning products. Such
27	review and revision shall include an implementation measure
28	that avoids wasting of existing inventories, accommodates
29	establishment of available vendors and products, enables
30	training of personnel in appropriate work practices, and
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1 allows the phase-out of products and practices inconsistent with the provisions of this section. 2 (c) The Auditor General shall assist in monitoring the 3 4 product procurement requirements. 5 (4)(a) Upon completion of the review required in б subsection (3), the department and each agency shall require 7 that a person who submits a bid, proposal, or reply for a 8 contract for the purchase of cleaning products must certify in writing whether the cleaning product subject to the bid, 9 proposal, or reply is an environmentally preferable cleaning 10 product. A person may certify that the product is not 11 12 environmentally preferable. (b) Upon evaluation of bids, proposals, or replies for 13 each public contract that involves the purchase of products 14 identified in subsection (3), the department or agency shall 15 16 identify the lowest responsible and responsive vendor and 17 other responsible and responsive vendors who have certified 18 that the products are environmentally preferable as set forth in the solicitation. 19 20 (c) The department or agency may consider life-cycle 21 costing when evaluating a bid, proposal, or reply on 2.2 environmentally preferable cleaning products. The department 23 shall adopt rules that specify the criteria to be used when considering life-cycle costing in evaluating bids, proposals, 2.4 25 or replies. (5)(a) In awarding a contract for the purchase of 26 environmentally preferable cleaning products, the department 27 2.8 or agency may allow up to a 10-percent price preference to a responsible and responsive vendor who has certified that the 29 products are environmentally preferable. An additional price 30 preference of up to 5 percent may be allowed if the vendor is 31

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1 also domiciled in the state. The amount of the price 2 preference shall be commensurate with the life cycle of the products, including raw material acquisition, production, 3 4 manufacturing, packaging, distribution, reuse, operation, maintenance, or final disposal of the products on a sliding 5 6 scale as established by department rule. 7 (b) Environmentally preferable cleaning products shall 8 be used where economically and technically feasible. If no 9 vendor offers environmentally preferable cleaning products 10 with measurable life-cycle costing factors, the contract shall be awarded to the lowest bidding qualified responsible and 11 12 responsive vendor. 13 (6) Any person may request the department to evaluate a cleaning product to determine if the product is eligible for 14 inclusion under state contracts. The department shall review 15 each reasonable proposal to determine its merit and, if it 16 17 finds that the product is environmentally preferable, it may 18 incorporate that product into its procurement procedures. 19 (7) The department and each agency shall review and 20 revise its procedures and specifications on a continuing basis 21 to encourage the use of environmentally preferable cleaning products and shall, in developing new procedures and 2.2 23 specifications, encourage the use of environmentally 2.4 preferable cleaning products. 25 (8) An agency, or a vendor contracting with such agency with respect to work performed under contract, must 26 27 procure environmentally preferable cleaning products if the 2.8 department determines that those products are available pursuant to subsection (3). A decision not to procure such 29 items must be based on the department's determination that 30 such procurement is not reasonably available within an 31

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acceptable period of time or fails to meet the performance standards set forth in the applicable specifications or fails to meet the performance standards of the agency. (9) The department shall establish rules for the implementation of environmentally preferable cleaning product б procurement, including a uniform reporting mechanism. Each agency shall report annually to the department its total expenditures on, and use of, environmentally preferable cleaning products. The department shall prepare annual summaries of statewide environmentally preferable purchases to be submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007. 2.4

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
