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property, this revision: (1) provides for an additional 73 alternative homestead exemption for most homeowners, (2) 74 75 provides for an additional alternative homestead exemption for low-income seniors, and (3) provides for the transfer of Save-76 77 Our-Homes benefits that are not related to school district 78 levies. With respect to nonhomestead property, this revision 79 allows the Legislature to provide by law for the assessment of 80 (4) affordable housing and (5) certain waterfront property under specific circumstances, (6) provides a \$25,000 exemption for 81 82 tangible personal property, and (7) provides for limitations on assessment increases for real property that is not homestead 83 84 property. Further, this revision (8) requires the Legislature to limit the authority of local governments other than school 85 86 districts to increase property taxes, (9) provides for a 2percent increase in the state sales and use tax and applies 87 revenues from the increase to reduce required local effort for 88 school districts, and (10) requires all county property 89 appraisers or persons responsible for the duties of a property 90 appraiser in certain counties in which the office of property 91 appraiser has been abolished to be elected. 92

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In more detail, this revision:

Provides for an additional homestead exemption equal 94 (1)to 40 percent of the median just value of homestead property in 95 the county for the prior year for the portion of the assessed 96 value greater than \$50,000. This exemption applies in any year 97 in which the amount of the exemption exceeds the amount of the 98 99 cumulative assessment limitation provided under Save Our Homes. 100 This exemption does not apply to school district levies. 787027

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101 (2)Provides for an additional homestead exemption for certain low-income seniors. Persons 65 or older whose household 102 income is less than \$23,604, adjusted annually for inflation, 103 are entitled to an additional alternative homestead exemption. 104 105 This exemption applies in any year in which the amount of the exemption exceeds the amount of the cumulative assessment 106 107 limitation provided under Save Our Homes. This exemption does 108 not apply to school district levies.

Provides for the transfer of cumulative Save-Our-Homes 109 (3) 110 benefits in a manner that does not affect school district levies. Homestead property owners will be able to transfer their 111 112 Save-Our-Homes benefit to a new homestead within 2 years after relinquishing their previous homestead; except, if the new 113 114 homestead is established on January 1, 2008, the previous homestead must have been relinquished in 2007. If the new 115 homestead has a higher just value than the old one, the benefit 116 can be transferred; if the new homestead has a lower just value, 117 the amount of benefit transferred will be reduced in proportion 118 of the just value of the new homestead to the just value of the 119 old homestead. The transferred benefit may not exceed \$1 120 121 million. This provision does not apply to school district levies on the new homestead. 122

(4) Provides for assessing certain rent-restricted
affordable housing property as provided by general law. This
provision does not apply to school district levies.

(5) Provides for assessing certain waterfront propertyused for commercial fishing, commercial water-dependent

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activities, and public access as provided by general law. This 128 provision does not apply to school district levies. 129 Authorizes an exemption from ad valorem taxes of 130 (6) \$25,000 of assessed value of tangible personal property. This 131 132 provision applies to all tax levies. Creates a limitation on assessment increases for 133 (7) 134 specified real property that is not entitled to the homestead 135 exemption.
