2 An act relating to a special election; providing for a 3 special election to be held January 29, 2008, pursuant to Section 5 of Article XI of the State Constitution, for the 4 approval or rejection by the electors of this state of 5 6 amendments to the State Constitution, proposed by joint 7 resolution, relating to a tangible personal property tax 8 exemption, homestead property assessments, assessment of 9 rent-restricted affordable housing and commercial and public-access waterfront property, increased homestead 10 exemption and additional homestead exemption for first-11 time homestead property owners and low-income seniors, 12 limitations on local government authority to increase ad 13 valorem taxes, and elected county property appraisers; 14 providing for publication of notice and for procedures; 15 16 providing an appropriation; providing a contingent effective date. 17 18 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 19 20 Section 1. Pursuant to Section 5 of Article XI of the 21 State Constitution, there shall be a special election on January 22 29, 2008, to be held concurrently with other statewide elections 23 24 held on that date, if any, at which there shall be submitted to 25 the electors of this state for approval or rejection the 26 amendments to the State Constitution proposed in Senate Joint Resolution 2-D or House Joint Resolution 7001D, 2007D Special 27 28 Session.

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29 Publication of notice shall be in accordance Section 2. 30 with Section 5 of Article XI of the State Constitution. The special election shall be held as other special elections are 31 32 held. Section 3. The sum of \$60,000 in nonrecurring funds from 33 the General Revenue Fund is appropriated to the Department of 34 35 State for fiscal year 2007-2008 for the purpose of advertising 36 the constitutional amendments being submitted to the electors of 37 this state at the special election called by this act. Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law 38 39 if enacted by a vote of at least three-fourths of the membership of each house of the Legislature and if Senate Joint Resolution 40 2-D or House Joint Resolution 7001D, 2007D Special Session, is 41 42 adopted by both houses of the Legislature.

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
