## Senate Joint Resolution

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 8 of Article IV of the State Constitution, relating to restoration of civil rights, to authorize the Legislature to prescribe additional circumstances under which certain reprieves may be granted and civil rights restored.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the following amendment to Section 8 of Article IV of the State Constitution is agreed to and shall be submitted to the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the next general election or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose:

## ARTICLE IV

## EXECUTIVE

## SECTION 8. Clemency.--

(a) Except in cases of treason and in cases where impeachment results in conviction, and except as otherwise prescribed by law, the governor may, by executive order filed with the custodian of state records, suspend collection of fines and forfeitures, grant reprieves not exceeding sixty days and, with the approval of two members of the cabinet, grant full or conditional pardons, restore civil rights, commute punishment, and remit fines and forfeitures for offenses.

(b) In cases of treason the governor may grant reprieves until adjournment of the regular session of the legislature convening next after the conviction, at which session the legislature may grant a pardon or further reprieve; otherwise the

31 (c) There may be created by law a parole and probation  
32 commission with power to supervise persons on probation and to  
33 grant paroles or conditional releases to persons under sentences  
34 for crime. The qualifications, method of selection and terms,  
35 not to exceed six years, of members of the commission shall be  
36 prescribed by law.

45 and punishments may be commuted.
