14	Section 1. Subsections (2), (4), and (7) of section
15	849.086, Florida Statutes, are amended, present subsections (9)
16	through (17) of that section are redesignated as subsections (10)
17	through (18), respectively, and a new subsection (9) is added to
18	that section, to read:

20	(2) DEFINITIONSAs used in this section:
21	(a) "Authorized game" means a game or series of games of
22	poker or dominoes which are played in a nonbanking manner.
23	(b) "Banking game" means a game in which the house is a
24	participant in the game, taking on players, paying winners, and
25	collecting from losers or in which the cardroom establishes a
26	bank against which participants play.
27	(c) "Cardroom" means a facility where authorized games are
28	played for money or anything of value and to which the public is
29	invited to participate in such games and charged a fee for

30 participation by the operator of such facility. Authorized games 31 and cardrooms do not constitute casino gaming operations.

32 (d) "Cardroom management company" means any individual not 33 an employee of the cardroom operator, any proprietorship, 34 partnership, corporation, or other entity that enters into an 35 agreement with a cardroom operator to manage, operate, or 36 otherwise control the daily operation of a cardroom.

(e) "Cardroom distributor" means any business that
distributes cardroom paraphernalia such as card tables, betting
chips, chip holders, dominoes, dominoes tables, drop boxes,
banking supplies, playing cards, card shufflers, and other
associated equipment to authorized cardrooms.

(f) "Cardroom operator" means a licensed pari-mutuel permitholder which holds a valid permit and license issued by the division pursuant to chapter 550 and which also holds a valid cardroom license issued by the division pursuant to this section which authorizes such person to operate a cardroom and to conduct authorized games in such cardroom.

(g) "Celebrity/charity poker tournament" means a game of poker which is played without limits on the amount wagered in any game or series of games or without limits on the rounds of betting established in this section if a minimum of 70 percent of the net proceeds from each poker tournament is donated to a charitable organization organized pursuant to s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

55 <u>(h) (g)</u> "Division" means the Division of Pari-mutuel 56 Wagering of the Department of Business and Professional 57 Regulation.

(i) (h) "Dominoes" means a game of dominoes typically played

with a set of 28 flat rectangular blocks, called "bones," which are marked on one side and divided into two equal parts, with zero to six dots, called "pips," in each part. The term also includes larger sets of blocks that contain a correspondingly higher number of pips. The term also means the set of blocks used to play the game.

(j) (i) "Gross receipts" means the total amount of money
 received by a cardroom from any person for participation in
 authorized games.

(k) "High-stakes poker tournament" means a game of poker which is played without limits on the amount wagered in any game or series of games or without limits on the rounds of betting established in this section.

72 (1) (j) "House" means the cardroom operator and all 73 employees of the cardroom operator.

74 (m) (k) "Net proceeds" means the total amount of gross 75 receipts received by a cardroom operator from cardroom operations 76 less direct operating expenses related to cardroom operations, including labor costs, admission taxes only if a separate 77 78 admission fee is charged for entry to the cardroom facility, 79 gross receipts taxes imposed on cardroom operators by this 80 section, the annual cardroom license fees imposed by this section on each table operated at a cardroom, and reasonable promotional 81 82 costs excluding officer and director compensation, interest on 83 capital debt, legal fees, real estate taxes, bad debts, 84 contributions or donations, or overhead and depreciation expenses 85 not directly related to the operation of the cardrooms.

86 <u>(n) (1)</u> "Rake" means a set fee or percentage of the pot 87 assessed by a cardroom operator for providing the services of a

Adopt rules, including, but not limited to: the 98 issuance of cardroom and employee licenses for cardroom 99 operations; the operation of a cardroom; recordkeeping and 100 reporting requirements; and the collection of all fees and taxes imposed by this section. 101 102 2. 117 fees imposed by this section. Permitholder internal controls are 118 mandated to ensure no compromise of state funds. To that end, a 119 roaming division auditor <u>shall</u> will monitor and verify the cash 120 flow and accounting of cardroom revenue for any given operating 121 day.

(7) CONDITIONS FOR OPERATING A CARDROOM.--

(a) A cardroom may be operated only at the location specified on the cardroom license issued by the division, and such location may only be the location at which the pari-mutuel permitholder is authorized to conduct pari-mutuel wagering activities pursuant to such permitholder's valid pari-mutuel permit or as otherwise authorized by law.

129 Any cardroom operator horserace, greyhound race, or jai (b) alai permitholder licensed under this section may operate a 130 cardroom at the pari-mutuel facility daily throughout the year. 131 132 The cardroom may be open a cumulative amount of 18 hours per day 133 on Monday through Friday and 24 hours per day on Saturday and 134 Sunday and on the holidays specified in s. 110.117(1) on any day 135 for a cumulative amount of 12 hours if the permitholder meets the 136 requirements under paragraph (5) (b).

137 (c) A cardroom operator must at all times employ and 138 provide a nonplaying dealer for each table on which authorized 139 card games which traditionally use a dealer are conducted at the 140 cardroom. Such dealers may not have a participatory interest in 141 any game other than the dealing of cards and may not have an 142 interest in the outcome of the game. The providing of such 143 dealers by a licensee does not constitute the conducting of a 144 banking game by the cardroom operator.

(d) A cardroom operator may award giveaways, jackpots, and

146 prizes to a player who holds certain combinations of cards 147 specified by the cardroom operator.

148 Each cardroom operator shall conspicuously post upon (e) the premises of the cardroom a notice which contains a copy of 149 150 the cardroom license; a list of authorized games offered by the 151 cardroom; the wagering limits imposed by the house, if any; any 152 additional house rules regarding operation of the cardroom or the 153 playing of any game; and all costs to players to participate, 154 including any rake by the house. In addition, each cardroom 155 operator shall post at each table a notice of the minimum and 156 maximum bets authorized at such table and the fee for 157 participation in the game conducted.

(f) The cardroom facility is subject to inspection by the division or any law enforcement agency during the licensee's regular business hours. The inspection must specifically include the permitholder internal control procedures approved by the division.

(g) A cardroom operator may refuse entry to or refuse to allow any person who is objectionable, undesirable, or disruptive to play, but such refusal may not be on the basis of race, creed, color, religion, gender, national origin, marital status, physical handicap, or age, except as provided in this section.

168(9)CHARITY/CELEBRITY POKER TOURNAMENTS AND HIGH-STAKES169POKER TOURNAMENTS.--

(a) A cardroom operator may host a charity/celebrity poker
 tournament six times each year for 8 consecutive calendar days at
 a pari-mutuel facility that is authorized to operate cardrooms
 during the hours that the pari-mutuel facility is open to conduct
 business. Such a tournament may be conducted only once in any 2-

Any payments made to charitable organizations 176 pursuant to this part shall not be calculated as gross receipts 177 for purposes of tax payments to the state under s. 178 849.086(13)(a). 179 (b) A cardroom operator may host a televised high-stakes 180 poker tournament twice each year for 8 consecutive calendar days 181 at a pari-mutuel facility that is authorized to operate cardrooms 182 during the hours that the pari-mutuel facility is open to conduct 183 business. Such a tournament may be conducted only once in any 6-

185 (c) A high-stakes poker tournament shall consist of a 186 series of games played at multiple tables. Tournaments shall be 187 played only with tournament chips that shall be provided to all participants in exchange for an entry fee and any subsequent 188 189 rebuys. All players shall receive an equal number of tournament 190 chips for their entry fee. Tournament chips shall have no cash 191 value and shall represent tournament points only. There shall be 192 no limitation on the number of tournament chips that can be used 193 for a bet except as determined by the cardroom operator. 194 Tournament chips may never be redeemed for cash or any other 195 thing of value. The entry fee for a tournament shall be decided 196 by the cardroom operator, but the entry fee may not exceed 197 \$10,000 in value and subsequent rebuys may not exceed 50 percent 198 of the required entry fee. The distribution of prizes and cash 199 awards shall be determined by the cardroom operator before entry 200 fees are accepted. For purposes of tournament play only, the term 201 "gross receipts" for the tournament means the total amount 202 received by the cardroom operator for all entry fees, player 203 rebuys, and fees for participation in tournaments, less the total
