10	(3) The Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement
11	Trust Fund Department of State may transfer ownership and
12	responsibility to any artifacts, documents, equipment, and other
13	forms of tangible personal property to the University of West
14	Florida to assist the university in the transition of the
15	management of the state-owned properties. All records,
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16 personnel, property, other than real property held under lease by the department from the Board of Trustees of the Internal 17 18 Improvement Trust Fund, and unexpended balances of 19 appropriations, allocations, or other funds of the Historic Pensacola Board of Trustees shall be transferred to the 20 21 University of West Florida to be used for its historic 22 preservation activities and responsibilities as set forth in the 23 contract with the Department of State. The transfer of 24 segregated funds must be made in such a manner that the relation 25 between program and revenue source as provided by law is 26 retained.

27 (4) (a) The University of West Florida is the governing 28 body for the management and maintenance of state-owned 29 properties contracted by this section and shall exercise those 30 powers provided through the contract with the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund delegated to it by 31 32 contract as well as performing all lawful acts necessary, and convenient, and incident to the effectuating of the contract, 33 34 its management and function, and the purposes purpose under this section and s. 267.1732. The University of West Florida may 35 36 contract with its direct-support organization described in s. 267.1732 to perform all acts that are lawful and permitted for 37 not-for-profit corporations under chapter 617 in assisting the 38 39 university in carrying out its responsibilities for historic preservation, and historic preservation research, and historic 40 41 preservation education responsibilities.

42 (b) The university or its direct-support organization, if43 permitted in its contract with the university, shall have the

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44 power to engage in any lawful business or activity to establish, 45 maintain, and operate the state-owned facilities and properties 46 <u>governed by this section</u> under contract with the Department of 47 State, including, but not limited to:

The renting or leasing for revenue of any land, 48 1. 49 improved or restored real estate, or personal property directly 50 related to carrying out the purposes for historic preservation, 51 historic preservation research, and historic preservation 52 education under terms and conditions of the contract with the 53 Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund 54 Department of State and deemed by the university to be in the 55 best interest of the state.

56 2. The selling of craft products created through the
57 operation and demonstration of historical museums, craft shops,
58 and other facilities.

59 3. The limited selling of merchandise relating to <u>Florida</u> 60 <u>history and archaeology</u> the historical and antiquarian period of 61 Pensacola and its surrounding territory and the historical 62 period of West Florida from the Apalachicola River to the 63 western boundaries of the state.

(c) The university or its direct-support organization, if
 permitted in <u>the</u> its contract with the university, shall have
 the authority to:

67 1. Enter into agreements to accept credit card payments as
68 compensation, and establish accounts in credit card banks for
69 the deposit of credit card sales invoices.



70 2. Fix and collect charges for admission to any of the 71 state-owned facilities governed by this section under contract 72 with the Department of State.

73 3. Permit the acceptance of tour vouchers issued by tour
74 organizations or travel agents for payment of admissions.

Adopt and enforce reasonable rules, regulations, or
policies to govern the conduct of the visiting public.

77 The Division of Historical Resources in the Department (5) 78 of State may contract with the University of West Florida to 79 serve as the regional office for the West Florida region of the state from the Apalachicola River to the western boundaries of 80 81 the state. In lieu of the establishment of a citizen advisory board as required by s. 267.031(5)(m), the University of West 82 Florida may use an existing direct-support organization of the 83 university provided that the membership of the direct-support 84 organization is representative of the area of the state to be 85 86 served and provides the needed expertise in the area of historic 87 preservation.

88 (6) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 287.057, the
89 University of West Florida or its direct-support organization
90 may enter into contracts or agreements with or without
91 competitive bidding, in its discretion, for the protection,
92 <u>enhancement</u>, or preservation of historic properties.

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
