Subsections (5), (6), and (7) of section 538.18, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 31 538.18 Definitions.--As used in this part, the term: 32 "Personal identification card" means any government-33 (5) issued photographic identification card a driver's license or 34 35 identification card issued by the Department of Highway Safety 36 and Motor Vehicles under s. 322.03 or s. 322.051, or a similar 37 card issued by another state, a military identification card, a passport, or an appropriate work authorization issued by the 38 United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services. 39 "Purchase transaction" means a transaction in which a 40 (6) secondary metals recycler gives consideration having a value in 41 excess of \$10 in exchange for regulated metals property. 42 (7)"Regulated metals property" means any item composed 43 44 primarily of any nonferrous metals, but shall not include aluminum beverage containers, used beverage containers, or 45 similar beverage containers. The term shall include stainless 46 47 steel beer kegs. Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 538.19, Florida 48 49 Statutes, is amended to read: 538.19 Records required. --50 The following information must be maintained on a form 51 (2)approved by the Department of Law Enforcement for each purchase 52 transaction: 53 54 (a) The name and address of the secondary metals recycler. The name, initials, or other identification of the 55 (b) individual entering the information on the ticket. 56 Page 2 of 6

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(C) The date and time of the transaction.

58 (d) The weight, quantity, or volume, and a description of the type of regulated metals property purchased in a purchase 59 transaction. 60

(e) The amount of consideration given in a purchase 61 transaction for the regulated metals property. 62

63 (f) A signed statement from the person delivering the regulated metals property stating that she or he is the rightful 64 65 owner of, or is entitled to sell, the regulated metals property being sold. If the purchase involves a stainless steel beer keg, 66 67 the seller must provide written documentation from the manufacturer that the seller is the owner of the stainless steel 68 beer keg or is an employee or agent of the manufacturer. 69

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Section 7. This act shall take effect October 1, 2008.

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
