A bill to be entitled
An act relating to public school physical education; amending s. 1003.455, F.S.; requiring specified physical education instruction for students in kindergarten through grade 5 and for certain grade 6 students; providing an appropriation for middle school students enrolled in certain physical education courses; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 1003.455, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
1003.455 Physical education; assessment.--
(3) Each district school board shall provide 150 minutes of at least 30 consecutive minutes per day of physical education instruction each week for students in kindergarten through grade 5 and for students in grade 6 who are enrolled in a school that contains one or more elementary grades. Students enrolled in such instruction shall be reported through the periodic student membership surveys, and records of such enrollment shall be audited pursuant to s. 1010.305. Such instruction may be provided by any instructional personnel as defined in s. 1012.01(2), regardless of certification, who are designated by the school principal. Each district school board is encouraged to provide 225 minutes of physical education each week for students in grades 6 through 8.

Section 2. The sum of $\$ 100,000,000$ is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund within the Florida Education Finance Program to the Department of Education to provide a value of 0.05 full-time equivalent student membership for each student enrolled in grades 6 through 8 who is also enrolled in a public school physical education course of at least 45 minutes per day. Such value shall be added to the total full-time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 6 through 8. Each school district must allocate the funds generated through this cost factor to the school that generated the funds. If the appropriation is insufficient to fully fund the total calculation, the appropriation shall be prorated.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
