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9	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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11	Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Don Davis
12	Physical Education Act."
13	Section 2. Section 1003.455, Florida Statutes, is amended
14	to read:
15	1003.455 Physical education; assessment
16	(1) It is the responsibility of each district school board
17	to develop a physical education program that stresses physical
18	fitness and encourages healthful, active lifestyles and to
19	encourage all students in prekindergarten through grade 12 to
20	participate in physical education. Physical education shall
21	consist of physical activities of at least a moderate intensity
22	level and for a duration sufficient to provide a significant
23	health benefit to students, subject to the differing
24	capabilities of students. All physical education programs and
25	curricula must be reviewed by a certified physical education
26	instructor.
27	(2) Each district school board shall adopt a written
28	physical education policy that details the school district's
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29 physical education program, the and expected program outcomes, the benefits of physical education, and the availability of one-30 on-one counseling concerning the benefits of physical education. 31 Each district school board shall provide 150 minutes 32 (3) of physical education each week for students in kindergarten 33 through grade 5 and for students in grade 6 who are enrolled in 34 35 a school that contains one or more elementary grades so that on 36 any day during which physical education instruction is conducted 37 there are at least 30 consecutive minutes per day. Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, the equivalent of one class 38 39 period per day of physical education for one semester of each year is required for students enrolled in grades 6 through 8. 40 Students enrolled in such instruction shall be reported through 41 42 the periodic student membership surveys, and records of such 43 enrollment shall be audited pursuant to s. 1010.305. Such 44 instruction may be provided by any instructional personnel as defined in s. 1012.01(2), reqardless of certification, who are 45 designated by the school principal. Each district school board 46 47 is encouraged to provide 225 minutes of physical education each week for students in grades 6 through 8. 48 49 The requirement in subsection (3) shall be waived for (4)50 a student who meets one of the following criteria: The student is enrolled or required to enroll in a 51 (a) remedial course. 52 The student's parent indicates in writing to the 53 (b)

## 551. The parent requests that the student enroll in another56course from among those courses offered as options by the school

58	2. The student is participating in physical activities
59	outside the school day which are equal to or in excess of the
60	mandated requirement.
61	(5) Each school district shall notify the student's parent
62	of the options available under subsection (4) before scheduling
63	the student to participate in physical education.
64	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
