Commission powers, mandatory and 15 16 discretionary. --17 The commission has the power to: (2)Request and receive criminal history record 18 (ee) 19 information for the purpose of screening applicants for certificates and public vehicle driver's licenses and pay a fee 20 21 for any such record. Such record information may include a 22 national criminal history records check with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The fingerprints may be submitted by the 23 24 commission to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) for state processing, and the department shall forward them to 25 26 the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history records check. All costs associated with transmittal and 27 processing shall be borne by the commission, the employer, or 28

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29	the person subject to the background check. The FDLE shall
30	invoice the commission for the fingerprints submitted each
31	month. The commission shall screen background results to
32	determine if an applicant meets licensure requirements.

33 (kk) Issue, or authorize its director, or any interim director, to issue and reissue, for good cause and without the 34 35 necessity of notice or public hearing, temporary permits to existing certificate holders and temporary public vehicle 36 37 driver's licenses provided that such temporary permits and temporary public vehicle driver's licenses shall be issued for a 38 period of time not to exceed 7 days. Upon showing of good cause, 39 temporary permits or temporary public vehicle driver's licenses 40 may be reissued, but shall not be reissued more than four 4 41 42 successive 7-day seven day periods without commission approval. 43 Issuance of a temporary permit or a temporary public vehicle 44 driver's license pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not in any way be construed as a commitment to issue a 45 permanent permit or annual public vehicle driver's license. No 46 47 action taken by the commission, or by the director or any interim director if so authorized, shall be construed to estop 48 49 the commission from subsequently denying an application for a 50 permanent permit or annual public vehicle driver's license.

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Section 8. Public vehicle driver's license.--

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(5) Each public vehicle driver's license:

(b) Shall be valid for 1 year and may be renewed annually for 1 additional year when the commission finds no criminal or traffic violations during the period of the expiring license. If the investigation reveals such violations, the license shall not

58	temporary public vehicle driver's licenses are exempt from this
