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An act relating to public K-12 educational instruction; creating s. 1003.4285, F.S.; requiring the establishment of high school diploma designations to identify unique coursework or student accomplishment; creating s. 1003.4287, F.S.; requiring each high school to offer specified Advanced Placement courses; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt a comprehensive plan for such implementation; amending s. 1011.62, F.S., relating to funds for the operation of schools; removing a cap on bonuses to teachers of International Baccalaureate, Advanced International Certificate of Education, and Advanced Placement instruction; providing for monetary student rewards; providing for calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership based on dual enrollment completion; providing for bonuses for dual enrollment

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 1003.4285, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

identify unique coursework or accomplishments of the student for purposes of postsecondary education or the workforce.

(2) The Commissioner of Education shall establish designations for the following:

- (a) Major areas of interest. A student shall receive a major area of interest designation pursuant to the student's completion of credits as provided in s. 1003.428.
- (b) Accelerated college credit. A student who successfully passes four or more college credit examinations in Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, Advanced International Certificate of Education, or dual enrollment coursework shall receive an accelerated college credit designation. The Commissioner of Education shall establish guidelines for successful passage of examinations or coursework in each of the accelerated college credit options.
- Section 2. Section 1003.4287, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 1003.4287 Advanced Placement courses; comprehensive plan.--
- (1) The purpose of this section is to ensure that each public high school student has equal access to a substantive and rigorous curriculum that is designed to challenge the student's mind, enhance the student's knowledge and skills, and prepare the student for success in college and work.
- (2) By the 2008-2009 school year, each public high school in the state must offer at least four Advanced Placement courses, one each in English, mathematics, science, and social studies. To fulfill this requirement, schools may utilize the

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Advanced Placement course offerings provided by the Florida Virtual School.

- (3) To assist with implementation of the requirement for offering rigorous Advanced Placement coursework, the State Board of Education shall develop and adopt a comprehensive plan for success that:
- (a) Ensures that all students have equal access to a substantive and rigorous curriculum that is designed to challenge their minds and enhance their knowledge and skills to prepare them for the demands of Advanced Placement coursework.
- (b) Establishes guidelines and a timeline for Advanced Placement and Pre-Advanced Placement teachers to receive training endorsed by the College Board in necessary content knowledge and instructional skills to prepare students for success in Advanced Placement courses and examinations.
- (c) Supports school administrators and guidance counselors in the receipt of professional development that enables them to create strong and effective Advanced Placement programs in their schools.
- (d) Assists teachers and school leaders in middle schools and high schools with implementation of vertical team training and other Pre-Advanced Placement training to prepare students for success in Advanced Placement courses.
- (e) Creates long-term and annual statewide goals for increasing:
- 1. The number and percentage of students enrolling in and completing Advanced Placement courses.

2. The number and percentage of students receiving a score of 3 or higher on Advanced Placement examinations.

- 3. The number and percentage of low-income and underrepresented students enrolling in and completing Advanced Placement courses.
- 4. The number and percentage of low-income and underrepresented students receiving a score of 3 or higher on Advanced Placement examinations.
- (f) Leverages federal and private funding available for Advanced Placement and Pre-Advanced Placement incentives and training.
- (g) Focuses state and federal funding to carry out activities that target school districts serving high concentrations of low-income and underrepresented students.
- (h) Provides a plan of communication that emphasizes the importance of Advanced Placement courses or other advanced courses to a student's ability to gain access to and succeed in postsecondary education. The plan for such communication should include information to students, teachers, counselors, administrators, school districts, community colleges, and state universities.
- (i) Annually evaluates the impact of the implementation of this section on the rates of student enrollment and success in Advanced Placement courses, on high school graduation rates, and on college enrollment rates. The evaluation must include a review of the progress toward meeting goals established pursuant to paragraph (e).

Section 3. Paragraphs (1), (m), and (n) of subsection (1) of section 1011.62, Florida Statutes, are amended, paragraphs (o) through (v) are redesignated as paragraphs (p) through (w), respectively, and a new paragraph (o) is added to that subsection, to read:

- 1011.62 Funds for operation of schools.--If the annual allocation from the Florida Education Finance Program to each district for operation of schools is not determined in the annual appropriations act or the substantive bill implementing the annual appropriations act, it shall be determined as follows:
- (1) COMPUTATION OF THE BASIC AMOUNT TO BE INCLUDED FOR OPERATION.--The following procedure shall be followed in determining the annual allocation to each district for operation:
- (1) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership based on International Baccalaureate examination scores of students.--
- 1. A value of 0.24 full-time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each student enrolled in an International Baccalaureate course who receives a score of 4 or higher on a subject examination. A value of 0.3 full-time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each student who receives an International Baccalaureate diploma. Such value shall be added to the total full-time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 9 through 12 in the subsequent fiscal year.

 $\underline{2.}$ The school district shall distribute to each classroom teacher who provided International Baccalaureate instruction:

- $\underline{a.1.}$ A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by the International Baccalaureate teacher in each International Baccalaureate course who receives a score of 4 or higher on the International Baccalaureate examination.
- $\underline{b.2.}$ An additional bonus of \$500 to each International Baccalaureate teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who has at least one student scoring 4 or higher on the International Baccalaureate examination, regardless of the number of classes taught or of the number of students scoring a 4 or higher on the International Baccalaureate examination.

Bonuses awarded to a teacher according to this <u>subparagraph</u> paragraph shall not exceed \$2,000 in any given school year and shall be in addition to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is scheduled to receive.

- 3. The school district shall distribute \$50 to each high school student who receives a score of 4 or higher on the International Baccalaureate examination.
- (m) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership based on Advanced International Certificate of Education examination scores of students.--
- 1. A value of 0.24 full-time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each student enrolled in a full-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education course who receives a score of E or higher on a subject examination. A value of 0.12 full-time equivalent student membership shall be

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Calculated for each student enrolled in a half-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education course who receives a score of E or higher on a subject examination. A value of 0.3 full-time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each student who receives an Advanced International Certificate of Education diploma. Such value shall be added to the total full-time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 9 through 12 in the subsequent fiscal year.

- $\underline{2}$. The school district shall distribute to each classroom teacher who provided Advanced International Certificate of Education instruction:
- <u>a.+.</u> A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by the Advanced International Certificate of Education teacher in each full-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education course who receives a score of E or higher on the Advanced International Certificate of Education examination. A bonus in the amount of \$25 for each student taught by the Advanced International Certificate of Education teacher in each half-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education course who receives a score of E or higher on the Advanced International Certificate of Education.
- $\underline{b.2.}$ An additional bonus of \$500 to each Advanced International Certificate of Education teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who has at least one student scoring E or higher on the full-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education examination, regardless of the number of classes taught or of the number of students

scoring an E or higher on the full-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education examination.

<u>c.3-</u> Additional bonuses of \$250 each to teachers of half-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education classes in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" which has at least one student scoring an E or higher on the half-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education examination in that class. The maximum additional bonus for a teacher awarded in accordance with this <u>sub-subparagraph</u> subparagraph shall not exceed \$500 in any given school year. Teachers receiving an award under <u>sub-subparagraph</u> b. <u>subparagraph 2.</u> are not eligible for a bonus under this sub-subparagraph subparagraph.

- Bonuses awarded to a teacher according to this <u>subparagraph</u> paragraph shall not exceed \$2,000 in any given school year and shall be in addition to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is scheduled to receive.
- 3. The school district shall distribute \$50 to each high school student who receives a score of E or higher on the full-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education examination or \$25 to each high school student who receives a score of E or higher on the half-credit Advanced International Certificate of Education examination.
- (n) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership based on College Board Advanced Placement scores of students.--
- 1. A value of 0.24 full-time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each student in each Advanced Placement

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Advanced Placement Examination for the prior year and <u>such value</u> <u>shall be</u> added to the total full-time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 9 through 12 in the subsequent fiscal year. Each district must allocate at least 80 percent of the funds provided to the district for Advanced Placement instruction, in accordance with this <u>subparagraph</u> paragraph, to the high school that generates the funds.

- $\underline{2.}$ The school district shall distribute to each classroom teacher who provided Advanced Placement instruction:
- <u>a.1.</u> A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by the Advanced Placement teacher in each Advanced Placement course who receives a score of 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination.
- <u>b.2.</u> An additional bonus of \$500 to each Advanced Placement teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who has at least one student scoring 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination, regardless of the number of classes taught or of the number of students scoring a 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination.

Bonuses awarded to a teacher according to this <u>subparagraph</u> paragraph shall not exceed \$2,000 in any given school year and shall be in addition to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is scheduled to receive.

3. The school district shall distribute \$50 to each high school student who receives a score of 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination.

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(o) Calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership based on dual enrollment completion by students.--

- 1. A value of 0.24 full-time equivalent student membership shall be calculated for each student who successfully completes a dual enrollment course and receives a grade of "A" or "B" for the prior year and such value shall be added to the total full-time equivalent student membership in basic programs for grades 9 through 12 in the subsequent fiscal year.
- 2. The school district shall distribute to each classroom teacher who provided dual enrollment instruction:
- a. A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by the dual enrollment teacher in each dual enrollment course who successfully completes the dual enrollment course and receives a grade of "A" or "B."
- b. An additional bonus of \$500 to each dual enrollment teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who has at least one student who successfully completes the dual enrollment course and receives a grade of "A" or "B."

Bonuses awarded to a teacher according to this subparagraph shall be in addition to any regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is scheduled to receive.

- 3. The school district shall distribute \$50 to each high school student who successfully completes a dual enrollment course and receives a grade of "A" or "B."
 - Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
