16 separate account, in an amount determined by the Legislature, to 17 be known as the "Special Facility Construction Account." The 18 Special Facility Construction Account shall be used to provide necessary construction funds to school districts which have 19 urgent construction needs but which lack sufficient resources at 20 21 present, and cannot reasonably anticipate sufficient resources 22 within the period of the next 3 years, for these purposes from currently authorized sources of capital outlay revenue. A school 23 district requesting funding from the Special Facility 24 25 Construction Account shall submit one specific construction 26 project, not to exceed one complete educational plant, to the 27 Special Facility Construction Committee. No district shall 28 receive funding for more than one approved project in any 3-year 29 period. The first year of the 3-year period shall be the first 30 year a district receives an appropriation. The department shall 31 encourage a construction program that reduces the average size 32 of schools in the district. The request must meet the following criteria to be considered by the committee: 33

34 1. The project must be deemed a critical need and must be recommended for funding by the Special Facility Construction 35 36 Committee. Prior to developing plans for the proposed facility, 37 the district school board must request a preapplication review by the Special Facility Construction Committee or a project 38 39 review subcommittee convened by the committee to include two 40 representatives of the department and two staff from school 41 districts not eligible to participate in the program. Within 60 42 days after receiving the preapplication review request, the 43 committee or subcommittee must meet in the school district to



44 review the project proposal and existing facilities. To determine whether the proposed project is a critical need, the 45 46 committee or subcommittee shall consider, at a minimum, the 47 capacity of all existing facilities within the district as 48 determined by the Florida Inventory of School Houses; the 49 district's pattern of student growth; the district's existing 50 and projected capital outlay full-time equivalent student enrollment as determined by the department; the district's 51 existing satisfactory student stations; the use of all existing 52 53 district property and facilities; grade level configurations; 54 and any other information that may affect the need for the 55 proposed project.

56 2. The construction project must be recommended in the 57 most recent survey or surveys <u>conducted and approved by the</u> 58 <u>Office of Educational Facilities with the assistance of</u> by the 59 district under the rules of the State Board of Education.

3. The construction project must appear on the district's
approved project priority list under the rules of the State
Board of Education.

4. The district must have selected and had approved a site
for the construction project in compliance with s. 1013.36 and
the rules of the State Board of Education.

5. With the assistance of the Office of Educational
Facilities, the district shall have developed a district school
board adopted list of facilities that do not exceed the norm for
net square feet occupancy requirements under the State
Requirements for Educational Facilities, using all possible
programmatic combinations for multiple use of space to obtain

72 maximum daily use of all spaces within the facility under 73 consideration.

6. Upon construction, the total cost per student station,
including change orders, must not exceed the cost per student
station as provided in subsection (6). The total project may not
<u>exceed the cost estimate approved by the Special Facility</u>
<u>Construction Committee, and additional funding may not be</u>
awarded except for providential causes.

80 7. There shall be an agreement signed by the district 81 school board stating that it will advertise for bids within 30 82 days of receipt of its encumbrance authorization from the 83 department.

84 8. The district shall, at the time of the request and for a continuing period of 3 years, levy the maximum millage against 85 86 their nonexempt assessed property value as allowed in s. 1011.71(2) or shall raise an equivalent amount of revenue from 87 the school capital outlay surtax authorized under s. 212.055(6). 88 Any district with a new or active project, funded under the 89 90 provisions of this subsection, shall be required to budget no 91 more than the value of 1.5 mills per year to the project to 92 satisfy the annual participation requirement in the Special Facility Construction Account. 93

94 9. If a contract has not been signed 90 days after the 95 advertising of bids, the funding for the specific project shall 96 revert to the Special Facility New Construction Account to be 97 reallocated to other projects on the list. However, an 98 additional 90 days may be granted by the commissioner.



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99	10. The department shall certify the inability of the
100	district to fund the survey-recommended project over a
101	continuous 3-year period using projected capital outlay revenue
102	derived from s. 9(d), Art. XII of the State Constitution, as
103	amended, paragraph (3)(a) of this section, and s. 1011.71(2).
104	11. The district shall have on file with the department an
105	adopted resolution acknowledging its 3-year commitment of all
106	unencumbered and future revenue acquired from s. 9(d), Art. XII
107	of the State Constitution, as amended, paragraph (3)(a) of this
108	section, and s. 1011.71(2).
109	12. Final phase III plans must be certified by the board
110	as complete and in compliance with the building and life safety
111	codes, and reviewed and approved by the Office of Educational
112	Facilities, prior to August 1.
