21	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

23	Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 720.304, Florida
24	Statutes, is amended to read:
25	720.304 Right of owners to peaceably assemble; display of
26	flag; SLAPP suits prohibited
27	(2) <u>(a)</u> Any homeowner may display one portable, removable
28	United States flag or official flag of the State of Florida in a
29	respectful manner, and <u>one</u> on Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day,

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30	Flag Day, Independence Day, and Veterans Day may display in a
31	respectful manner portable, removable official <u>flag</u> flags , <u>in a</u>
32	respectful manner, not larger than 4 1/2 feet by 6 feet, which
33	represents represent the United States Army, Navy, Air Force,
34	Marine Corps, or Coast Guard, <u>or a POW-MIA flag,</u> regardless of
35	any <u>covenants, restrictions, bylaws,</u> declaration rules <u>,</u> or
36	requirements of the association dealing with flags or
37	decorations.
38	(b) Any homeowner may erect a freestanding flagpole no more
39	than 20 feet high on any portion of the homeowner's real
40	property, regardless of any covenants, restrictions, bylaws,
41	rules, or requirements of the association, if the flagpole does
42	not obstruct sightlines at intersections and is not erected
43	within or upon an easement. The homeowner may further display in
44	a respectful manner from that flagpole, regardless of any
45	covenants, restrictions, bylaws, rules, or requirements of the
46	association, one official United States flag, not larger than 4
47	1/2 feet by 6 feet, and may additionally display one official
48	flag of the State of Florida or the United States Army, Navy, Air
49	Force, Marines, or Coast Guard, or a POW-MIA flag. Such
50	additional flag must be equal in size to or smaller than the
51	United States flag.
52	(c) This subsection applies to all community development
53	districts and homeowners' associations, regardless of whether
54	such homeowners' associations are authorized to impose
55	assessments that may become a lien on the parcel.
56	Section 2. Subsection (3) is added to section 723.075,
57	Florida Statutes, to read:

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59	(3) Notwithstanding subsection (1), if a portion of the
60	park contains concrete block homes occupying lots under 99-year
61	leases, those homeowners may be part of the association and may
62	serve on the board of directors of the association based on the
63	percentage of lots containing concrete block homes to the total
64	number of mobile home lots in the park.
