(3) (a) At the first meeting of the council each year, themembers shall elect a chair and a vice chair.

(b) A vacancy in the office of chair or vice chair shallbe filled by vote of the remaining members.

(4) (a) The council shall make a systematic study of the
conditions affecting black men and boys, including, but not
limited to, homicide rates, arrest and incarceration rates,
poverty, violence, drug abuse, death rates, disparate annual
income levels, school performance in all grade levels including
postsecondary levels, and health issues.

(b) The council shall propose measures to alleviate and correct the underlying causes of the conditions described in paragraph (a). These measures may consist of changes to the law or systematic changes that can be implemented without legislative action.

(c) The council may study other topics suggested by theLegislature or as directed by the chair of the council.

(d) The council shall receive suggestions or comments
pertinent to the applicable issues from members of the
Legislature, governmental agencies, public and private
organizations, and private citizens.

80 (5) The Office of the Attorney General shall provide staff81 and administrative support to the council.

(6) The council shall meet quarterly and at other times at
the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of council
members and approved by the Attorney General.

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85 (7) Eleven of the members of the council shall constitute
86 a quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members
87 present is required for final action.

(8) (a) The council shall issue its first annual report by December 15, 2007, and by December 15 each following year, stating the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the council. The council shall submit the report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of the standing committees of jurisdiction in each chamber.

(b) The initial report must include the findings of an
investigation into factors causing black-on-black crime from the
perspective of public health related to mental health, other
health issues, cultural disconnection, and cultural identity
trauma.

(9) Members of the council shall serve without
compensation. Members are entitled to reimbursement for per diem
and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061. State officers
and employees shall be reimbursed from the budget of the agency
through which they serve. Other members may be reimbursed by the
Department of Legal Affairs.

(10) The council and any subcommittees it forms <u>are shall</u>
be subject to the provisions of chapter 119, related to public
records, and the provisions of chapter 286, related to public
meetings.

(11) Each member of the council who is not otherwise required to file a financial disclosure statement pursuant to s. 8, Art. II of the State Constitution or s. 112.3144, must file a Dura 1455

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113 disclosure of financial interests pursuant to s. 112.3145. 114 (12) Notwithstanding subsection (6), the Attorney General shall: 115 116 (a) Within 60 days after the effective date of this act, 117 fix a date for the initial meeting of the council. (b) Notify each member of the council of the time, date, 118 119 and place where the initial meeting will be held. 120 (c) Make any other arrangements concerning the initial 121 meeting of the council. (d) Serve as the presiding officer at the initial meeting 122 of the council until a chair is elected. 123 (13) This section expires July 1, 2012, unless reenacted 124 125 by the Legislature. 126 Section 2.
