8	(f) The state land planning agency may designate up to five
9	local governments as Urban Placemaking Initiative Pilot Projects.
10	The purpose of the pilot project program is to assist local
11	communities with redevelopment of primarily single-use suburban
12	areas that surround strategic corridors and crossroads, and to
13	create livable, sustainable communities that have a sense of
14	place. Pilot communities must have a county population of at
15	least 350,000, be able to demonstrate an ability to administer
16	the pilot project, and have appropriate potential redevelopment
17	areas suitable for the pilot project. Recognizing that both the

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form of existing development patterns and strict application of 18 transportation concurrency requirements create obstacles to such 19 redevelopment, the pilot project program shall further the 20 21 ability of such communities to cultivate mixed-use and form-based 22 communities that integrate all modes of transportation. The pilot project program shall provide an alternative regulatory framework 23 24 that allows for the creation of a multimodal concurrency district 25 that over the planning time period allows pilot project 26 communities to incrementally realize the goals of the 27 redevelopment area by guiding redevelopment of parcels and cultivating multimodal development in targeted transitional 28 29 suburban areas. The Department of Transportation shall provide 30 technical support to the state land planning agency and the department and the agency shall provide technical assistance to 31 32 the local governments in the implementation of the pilot 33 projects. 34 1. Each pilot project community shall adopt criteria for designating specific urban placemaking redevelopment areas and 35 36 general location maps in the future land use element of its 37 comprehensive plan. Such redevelopment areas must be within an 38 adopted urban service boundary or functional equivalent. Each 39 pilot project community shall also adopt comprehensive plan amendments that set forth criteria for the development of the 40 41 urban placemaking areas that contain land use and transportation 42 strategies, including, but not limited to, the community design 43 elements set forth in paragraph (b). A pilot project community 44 shall undertake a process of public engagement to coordinate 45 community vision, citizen interest, and development goals for developments within the urban placemaking redevelopment areas. 46

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47	2. Each pilot project community may assign transportation
48	concurrency or trip generation credits and impact fee exemptions
49	or reductions and establish concurrency exceptions for
50	developments that meet the adopted comprehensive plan criteria
51	for urban placemaking redevelopment areas.
