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12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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14	Section 1. Subsection (5) of section 1006.06, Florida
15	Statutes, is amended to read:

17	(5)(a) Each district school board shall implement school
18	breakfast programs in all elementary schools that make breakfast
19	available to all students in <u>the schools.</u> kindergarten through
20	grade 6 in each district school, unless the elementary school
21	goes only through grade 5, in which case the requirement shall
22	apply only through grade 5. Each district school board shall
23	implement breakfast programs in all elementary schools in which
24	students are eligible for free and reduced price lunch meals, to
25	the extent specifically funded in the General Appropriations Act.
26	Each district school board is encouraged to expand its school
27	breakfast programs to make breakfast available to all students in
28	its middle and high schools.
29	(b) Beginning in the 2008-2009 school year:

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30 1. Each district school board is encouraged to make 31 available universal free breakfast to eligible students in each 32 elementary, middle, and high school in which 80 percent or more 33 of students are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Elementary, middle, and high school students in these 34 2. 35 schools shall annually receive information prepared by the 36 district's food service administration regarding the school 37 breakfast program. The information shall be communicated through 38 school announcements and written notice sent to all parents.

39 (c) A district school board may operate a breakfast program 40 providing for food preparation at the school site or in central 41 locations with distribution to designated satellite schools or 42 any combination thereof.

43 <u>(d) (b)</u> The commissioner shall make every reasonable effort 44 to ensure that any school designated a "severe need school" 45 receives the highest rate of reimbursement to which it is 46 entitled pursuant to 42 U.S.C. s. 1773 for each free and reduced 47 price breakfast served.

48 <u>(e) (c)</u> The department shall calculate and distribute a 49 school district breakfast supplement for each school year by 50 multiplying the state breakfast rate as specified in the General 51 Appropriations Act by the number of free and reduced price 52 breakfast meals served.

(f) The department is encouraged to develop, with national breakfast foundations and the Department of Agriculture, a costefficient incentive model to encourage school districts to expand student participation in school breakfast programs. The costefficient expansion model shall be developed with the use of existing funds and those funds made available from private

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60 <u>(g)</u>(d) The Legislature shall provide sufficient funds in 61 the General Appropriations Act to reimburse participating school 62 districts for the difference between the average federal 63 reimbursement for free and reduced price breakfasts and the 64 average statewide cost for breakfasts.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
