A bill to be entitled

An act relating to community residential homes; amending s. 419.001, F.S.; requiring the provision of security for community residential homes serving residents referred by criminal justice agencies; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, municipalities and their communities are plagued with and given the responsibility of addressing the inadequacies of the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, the Department of Juvenile Justice, the Department of Children and Family Services, and the Agency for Health Care Administration, which do not have adequate facilities to provide services for their present and future wards, and

WHEREAS, there are no longer enough state institutions to house those with mental disabilities within the State of Florida, and

WHEREAS, these same disabled individuals end up committing crimes, being arrested, and thus becoming defendants in criminal cases within the state, and

WHEREAS, these accused defendants are being housed in community residences throughout our communities without the adequate safeguards that exist within the criminal justice system, and

WHEREAS, many of these same defendants may be tried for their crimes and found not guilty by reason of insanity and are still housed in these same types of residential homes within our communities, and HB 1475 2008

Section 1. Subsection (12) is added to section 419.001, Florida Statutes, to read:

419.001 Site selection of community residential homes.-(12) A community residential home that serves residents
who are referred by a criminal justice agency, as defined in s.
943.045(10), shall provide 24-hour security at that location in
order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the other
residents and of the citizens in the surrounding community.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
