18 (b) The Rural Economic Development Initiative, known as 19 "REDI," is created within the Office of Tourism, Trade, and 20 Economic Development, and the participation of state and regional 21 agencies in this initiative is authorized.

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(2) As used in this section, the term:

(a) "Catalyst project" means a business locating or expanding in a rural area of critical economic concern which is likely to serve as an economic growth opportunity of regional significance for the growth of a regional target industry cluster. The project shall provide capital investment of significant scale which will affect the entire region and will facilitate the development of high-wage and high-skill jobs.

30 (b) "Catalyst site" means a parcel or parcels of land 31 within a rural area of critical economic concern that has been 32 prioritized by representatives of the jurisdictions within the 33 rural area of critical economic concern, reviewed by REDI, and 34 approved by the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 35 Development for purposes of locating a catalyst project.

36 (c) (a) "Economic distress" means conditions affecting the 37 fiscal and economic viability of a rural community, including such factors as low per capita income, low per capita taxable 38 39 values, high unemployment, high underemployment, low weekly earned wages compared to the state average, low housing values 40 compared to the state average, high percentages of the population 41 42 receiving public assistance, high poverty levels compared to the 43 state average, and a lack of year-round stable employment 44 opportunities.

45 <u>(d) "Rural area of critical economic concern" means a rural</u> 46 <u>community, or a region composed of rural communities, designated</u> 47 <u>by the Governor, which has been adversely affected by an</u>

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extraordinary economic event, severe or chronic distress, or a 48 natural disaster or which presents a unique economic development 49 opportunity of regional impact. 50 (e) (b) "Rural community" means: 51 52 1. A county with a population of 75,000 or less. A county with a population of 120,000 100,000 or less 53 2. 54 that is contiguous to a county with a population of 75,000 or 55 less. 3. A municipality within a county described in subparagraph 56 57 1. or subparagraph 2. 4. An unincorporated federal enterprise community or an 58 59 incorporated rural city with a population of 25,000 or less and an employment base focused on traditional agricultural or 60 resource-based industries, located in a county not defined as 61 62 rural, which has at least three or more of the economic distress 63 factors identified in paragraph (a) and verified by the Office of 64 Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. 65 66 For purposes of this paragraph, population shall be determined in 67 accordance with the most recent official estimate pursuant to s. 186.901. 68 69 REDI shall be responsible for coordinating and focusing (3) the efforts and resources of state and regional agencies on the 70 problems which affect the fiscal, economic, and community 71 72 viability of Florida's economically distressed rural communities, 73 working with local governments, community-based organizations, 74 and private organizations that have an interest in the growth and 75 development of these communities to find ways to balance 76 environmental and growth management issues with local needs.

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(4) REDI shall review and evaluate the impact of <u>laws</u>
statutes and rules on rural communities and <u>shall</u> work to
minimize any adverse impact <u>and shall undertake outreach and</u>
<u>capacity-building efforts</u>.

(5) REDI shall facilitate better access to state resources by promoting direct access and referrals to appropriate state and regional agencies and statewide organizations. REDI may undertake outreach, capacity-building, and other advocacy efforts to improve conditions in rural communities. These activities may include sponsorship of conferences and achievement awards.

(6) (a) By August 1 of each year, the head of each of the following agencies and organizations shall designate a high-level staff person from within the agency or organization to serve as the REDI representative for the agency or organization:

113	names of the designees and alternates shall be sent to the
114	director of the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic
115	Development.
116	(b) Each REDI representative must have comprehensive
117	knowledge of his or her agency's functions, both regulatory and
118	service in nature, and of the state's economic goals, policies,
119	and programs. This person shall be the primary point of contact
120	for his or her agency with REDI on issues and projects relating
121	to economically distressed rural communities and with regard to
122	expediting project review, shall ensure a prompt effective
123	response to problems arising with regard to rural issues, and
124	shall work closely with the other REDI representatives in the
125	identification of opportunities for preferential awards of
126	program funds and allowances and waiver of program requirements
127	when necessary to encourage and facilitate long-term private
128	capital investment and job creation.

(c) The REDI representatives shall work with REDI in the review and evaluation of statutes and rules for adverse impact on rural communities and the development of alternative proposals to mitigate that impact.

(d) Each REDI representative shall be responsible for
ensuring that each district office or facility of his or her
agency is informed about the Rural Economic Development

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136 Initiative and for providing assistance throughout the agency in 137 the implementation of REDI activities.

138 (7) (a) REDI may recommend to the Governor up to three rural 139 areas of critical economic concern. A rural area of critical economic concern must be a rural community, or a region composed 140 of such, that has been adversely affected by an extraordinary 141 142 economic event or a natural disaster or that presents a unique 143 economic development opportunity of regional impact that will 144 create more than 1,000 jobs over a 5-year period. The Governor 145 may by executive order designate up to three rural areas of critical economic concern which will establish these areas as 146 147 priority assignments for REDI as well as to allow the Governor, acting through REDI, to waive criteria, requirements, or similar 148 provisions of any economic development incentive. Such incentives 149 shall include, but not be limited to: the Qualified Target 150 Industry Tax Refund Program under s. 288.106, the Quick Response 151 152 Training Program under s. 288.047, the Quick Response Training 153 Program for participants in the welfare transition program under 154 s. 288.047(8), transportation projects under s. 288.063, the 155 brownfield redevelopment bonus refund under s. 288.107, and the 156 rural job tax credit program under ss. 212.098 and 220.1895.

157 (b) Designation as a rural area of critical economic concern under this subsection shall be contingent upon the 158 execution of a memorandum of agreement among the Office of 159 160 Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development; the governing body of 161 the county; and the governing bodies of any municipalities to be included within a rural area of critical economic concern. Such 162 163 agreement shall specify the terms and conditions of the designation, including, but not limited to, the duties and 164 165 responsibilities of the county and any participating

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166 municipalities to take actions designed to facilitate the 167 retention and expansion of existing businesses in the area, as 168 well as the recruitment of new businesses to the area.

169 (c) Each rural area of critical economic concern may 170 designate catalyst projects provided that each catalyst project is specifically recommended by REDI, identified as a catalyst 171 project by Enterprise Florida, Inc., and confirmed as a catalyst 172 project by the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 173 174 Development. All state agencies and departments shall use all 175 available tools and resources to the extent permissible by law to 176 promote the creation and development of each catalyst project and 177 the development of catalyst sites.

178 <u>(8) REDI shall assist local governments within rural areas</u> 179 <u>of critical economic concern with comprehensive planning needs</u> 180 <u>pursuant to s. 163.3184(20) and which implement the provisions of</u> 181 <u>this section. Such assistance shall reflect a multidisciplinary</u> 182 <u>approach among all agencies and shall include economic</u> 183 <u>development and planning objectives.</u>

184 <u>(a) A local government may request assistance in the</u> 185 preparation of plan amendments that will stimulate economic 186 <u>activity.</u>

187 <u>1. The local government must contact the Office of Tourism,</u>
 188 <u>Trade, and Economic Development to request assistance.</u>

189 <u>2. REDI representatives shall meet with the local</u> 190 government within 15 days after such request to develop the scope 191 of assistance that will be provided to assist the development, 192 transmittal, and adoption of the proposed comprehensive plan 193 amendment.

1943. As part of the assistance provided, REDI representatives195shall also identify other needed local and developer actions for

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196 approval of the project and recommend a timeline for the local 197 government and developer which will minimize project delays. (b) In addition, REDI shall solicit requests each year for 198 199 assistance from local governments within a rural area of critical 200 economic concern to update the future land use element and other 201 associated elements of the local government's comprehensive plan 202 to better position the community to respond to economic 203 development potential within the county or municipality. REDI 204 shall provide direct assistance to such local governments to 205 update their comprehensive plans pursuant to this paragraph. At 206 least one comprehensive planning technical assistance effort 207 shall be selected each year. (c) REDI shall develop and annually update a technical 208 209 assistance manual based upon experiences learned in providing 210 direct assistance under this subsection. 211 (9) As further incentive for development of jobs and 212 advancement of health care in areas that are both a fiscally 213 constrained county pursuant to s. 218.67 and a rural area of 214 critical economic concern as designated by the Governor pursuant 215 to s. 288.0656, the provisions of Rule 9J-5.006(5), Florida 216 Administrative Code, regulating sprawl shall not be applicable to 217 a development of regional impact governed by s. 380.06 if such 218 development is a multiuse development containing at least three distinct uses and such development provides a hospital with a 219 minimum of 70 beds, both of which criteria shall be met within 10 220 221 years after receipt of a final development order.

222 (10)(8) REDI shall submit a report to the Governor, the 223 President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 224 Representatives each year on or before <u>September</u> February 1 on 225 all REDI activities for the prior fiscal year. This report shall

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226 include a status report on all projects currently being coordinated through REDI, the number of preferential awards and 227 228 allowances made pursuant to this section, the dollar amount of 229 such awards, and the names of the recipients. The report shall 230 also include a description of all waivers of program requirements 231 granted.
