Section 1. Subsections (1) through (3) of section 514.023, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

514.023 Sampling of beach waters; health advisories.--

21 (1)(3) As used in For purposes of this section, the term
22 "beach waters" means the waters along the coastal and
23 intracoastal beaches and shores of the state, and includes salt
24 water and brackish water.

(2) (1) The department may adopt and enforce rules to protect the health, safety, and welfare of persons using the beach waters of the state. The rules must establish health

standards and prescribe procedures and timeframes for bacteriological sampling of beach waters.

(3) The department may issue health advisories if the quality of beach waters fails to meet standards established by the department. The issuance of health advisories related to the results of bacteriological sampling of beach waters is preempted to the state. When the Department of Health issues a health advisory against swimming in beach waters on the basis of finding elevated levels of fecal coliform or enterococci bacteria in a water sample, the department shall contemporaneously notify the relevant local government and the local office of the Department of Environmental Protection, which shall promptly investigate wastewater treatment facilities within 1 mile of the affected beach to determine if a facility experienced an incident that may have contributed to the contamination. Upon completion, the Department of Environmental Protection shall notify the relevant local government in writing or by electronic correspondence of the results of its investigation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
