18	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

20	Section 1. Section 2 of chapter 23444, Laws of Florida,
21	1945, as amended by chapters 73-573 and 2000-448, Laws of
22	Florida, and by City of Orlando Ordinance 33874, enacted June
23	18, 2001, is amended to read:
24	Section 2. Employees included.
25	Members of said Fire Department shall be construed as
26	including all officers and firefighters regularly employed in
27	said department, and whose employment shall be regular and
28	continuous and not of a temporary character, provided, however,

29 the secretaries, stenographers and switchboard operators shall 30 not be covered by the provisions of this Act. For the purpose of this Act the term "widow" shall include widower; the term "wife" 31 shall include "husband"; the term "mother" shall include 32 "father"; reference to the masculine pronoun shall include the 33 feminine and vice versa; the term "issue" shall include a 34 35 member's natural and adopted children as well as children in gestation; and the terms "legal guardian" or "guardians of said 36 37 issue" shall include a court-appointed guardian of the property of said issue or a trustee of a trust of which said issue is a 38 beneficiary. Further provided that members who are DROP 39 participants will no longer be participants in this fund, nor 40 eligible for any benefits hereunder. 41

Section 9. Permanent disability pension; in line of duty. 45 Any active member of the fire department who shall become 46 47 permanently and totally disabled, if the disability is directly caused by and attributable to the performance of duty as a 48 49 member of the department, shall be entitled to a pension of a 50 monthly sum of 80 percent of the member's average monthly salary; provided, however, a member who has completed 40 years 51 52 of credited service shall be entitled to receive an additional 2 53 percent over the 80 percent for each year of credited service in 54 excess of 40 years of credited service but not to exceed 100 percent money equivalent to that sum of money which said member, 55 whether or not properly qualified, would have been entitled to 56 Page 2 of 8

57 elect as a monthly pension for twenty five (25) years of service 58 under amended Section 12 of this act. The phrase "permanently and totally disabled" shall be construed to mean and include the 59 60 loss of one or more limbs, loss of sight in one or both eyes, loss of hearing in one or both ears and any other condition 61 which renders the member unfit to perform the required duties of 62 63 the member's rank held at the time of impairment. Upon the death of the member on said disability pension provided in this 64 65 section, benefits shall be paid as follows:

If a member has not elected and started receipt of the 66 (1)67 Section 34(1)(a) life with ten (10) years certain form of payment, or the Section 34(1)(b) life only form of payment, or 68 the Section 34(1)(c) joint pensioner form of payment, benefits 69 70 shall be paid pursuant to Section 14, "Benefits Payable Upon 71 Death of Member", to the surviving spouse and issues under the 72 age of eighteen (18), or dependent parents, and Section 35, "10 Year Certain Guarantee", if applicable. 73

If a member has elected and started receipt of the 74 (2)75 Section 34(1)(a) life with ten (10) years certain form of payment and the member has not received 120 monthly payments, 76 77 then benefits otherwise payable to the member shall be paid 78 pursuant to Section 32, "Beneficiaries", for the remainder of 79 the 120 monthly payments beginning on the first day of the month immediately following the member's death regardless of the age 80 of the deceased member. If the firefighter makes this election, 81 82 no benefits shall be paid pursuant to Section 14(5)(b) or Section 14(5)(d) to the surviving spouse, issue in being under 83 the age of eighteen (18), or dependent parents. however, the firefighter may designate as beneficiaries the surviving spouse, issue in being under the age of eighteen (18), or dependent parents to receive the remainder of the 120 monthly payments.

89 (3) If a member has elected and started receipt of the
90 Section 34(1)(b) life only form of payment, no further payments
91 shall be made upon the death of the member.

92 (4) If a member has elected and started receipt of the
93 Section 34(1)(c) joint pensioner form of payment, benefits shall
94 be paid as provided therein.

Notwithstanding anything that may be to the contrary in this 96 act, at age forty-seven (47), a member then receiving benefits 97 98 under this section may make the election provided in Section 99 12(1) or Section 12(2) as the case may be and Section 18, all of 100 this act (Laws of Fla. ch. 23444(1945), as amended) in the manner therein specified, provided he is qualified by length of 101 service prior to the disability and provided he makes the 102 103 election within the thirty-day period after reaching age fortyseven (47). If the election is exercised in favor of the 104 105 pension, the pension shall be based only on service and salary 106 earned prior to the date of disability. If the election is 107 exercised, all of the member's rights and the rights of the member's surviving spouse and issue, and dependent parents under 108 Section 14 shall cease. 109

197 Orlando Firefighter Pension Fund, the Board of Trustees is 198 hereby delegated the authority to adopt by rule changes to 199 chapter 23444, Laws of Florida, 1945, as amended, in order to comply with said laws, which rules shall have the force of law 200 201 and shall be considered part of chapter 23444, Laws of Florida, 202 1945, as amended. 203 Section 6. This act is only an enabling act and is 204 contingent upon contractual agreement through the collective 205 bargaining process between the City of Orlando and the respective certified bargaining agent for firefighters employed 206 by the City of Orlando. 207 208 Section 7. This section shall take effect upon becoming a law; section 1 shall take effect July 1, 2008; section 3 shall 209 210 be effective retroactive to July 1, 1988; sections 2 and 4 shall be effective retroactive to January 1, 2008; and sections 5 and 211 6 shall take effect July 1, 2008. 212
