The Committee on Health Policy (Saunders) recommended the following **amendment**:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete lines 27-59

and insert:

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7 (a) Prescription and nonprescription enteral formulas for 8 home use which are ordered or physician prescribed by a 9 prescribing practitioner licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, or chapter 464, as medically necessary for the treatment of 10 inherited diseases of amino acid, organic acid, carbohydrate, or 11 12 fat metabolism as well as malabsorption originating from congenital defects present at birth or acquired during the 13 neonatal period. Such coverage for inherited diseases of amino 14 15 acids and organic acids shall include food products modified to 16 be low protein, in an amount not to exceed \$2,500 annually for any insured individual, through the age of 24. 17
