In addition to subparagraph 1., any criminal 33 2. 34 intelligence information or criminal investigative information 35 that is a photograph, videotape, or image of any part of the body 36 of the victim of a sexual offense prohibited under chapter 794, 37 chapter 800, or chapter 827, regardless of whether the 38 photograph, videotape, or image identifies the victim, is 39 confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of 40 the State Constitution. This exemption applies to photographs, videotapes, or images held as criminal intelligence information 41 42 or criminal investigative information before, on, or after the 43 effective date of the exemption.
