An act relating to temporary motor vehicle license tags;
 placement of temporary tags on vehicles; revising provisions for implementation of an electronic, print-ondemand, temporary tag issuance system; providing that the system may be used at the option of the issuer; removing a timeframe for implementation of the system; repealing s. 320.96, F.S., relating to implementation of an electronic, print-on-demand, temporary license plate system; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsections (4) and (8) of section 320.131, Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsection (9) is added to that section, to read:
320.131 Temporary tags.--
(4) (a) Temporary tags shall be conspicuously displayed in the rear license plate bracket or, attached to the inside of the rear window in an upright position so as to be clearly visible from the reax of the vehicle on vehicles requiring front display of license plates, temporary tags shall be displayed on the front of the vehicle in the location where the metal license plate would normally be displayed.
(b) The department shall designate specifications for the media upon which the temporary tag is printed. Such media shall be either nonpermeable or subject to weatherproofing so that it

maintains its structural integrity, including graphic and data adhesion, in all weather conditions after being placed on a vehicle.
(8) The department may administer an electronic system for licensed motor vehicle dealers to use for in issuing temporary tags license plates. Upon issuing a temporary tag license plate, the dealer shall access the electronic system and enter the appropriate vehicle and owner information within the timeframe specified by department rule. If a dealer fails to comply with the department's requirements for issuing temporary tags license plates using the electronic system, the department may deny, suspend, or revoke a license under s. 320.27(9)(b)16. upon proof that the licensee has failed to comply with the department's requirements. The department may adopt rules to administer this section.
(9) The department may implement an electronic, print-ondemand, temporary tag issuance system for the optional use of department-authorized issuers of temporary tags. This system shall enable the department to issue, on demand, a temporary tag number in response to a request from the issuer via a secure electronic exchange of data and then enable the issuer to print the temporary tag with all required information. The department may adopt rules as necessary to implement this program.

Section 2. Section 320.96, Florida Statutes, is repealed.
Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
