2	An act relating to title insurance; creating the Florida
3	2008 Title Insurance Study Advisory Council; providing for
4	membership; providing for administrative support for the
5	council; providing responsibilities of the council;
6	authorizing the council to invite independent actuaries to
7	provide certain information; providing council meeting
8	requirements; requiring the council to file a report with
9	the Governor and Legislature; providing for termination of
10	the council; providing an effective date.

12	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that a stable and efficient
13	title insurance delivery system is necessary to promote the
14	economic well-being of the residents of Florida, and
15	WHEREAS, Florida consumers have a right to effective and
16	affordable title insurance, and
17	WHEREAS, title insurance is essential to ensure homeowners
18	and landowners of the safety of real estate transfers in Florida,
19	and
20	WHEREAS, investors and lienholders require the security
21	accorded their business interests by a financially stable and
22	regulated title insurance industry, and
23	WHEREAS, a viable title insurance delivery system requires
24	efficient and comprehensive state oversight to regulate insurer
25	and agent solvency, education, licensing, and discipline and the
26	establishment of nondiscriminatory title insurance rates and
27	forms, and
28	WHEREAS, it is the express intent of the Legislature to

29 conduct a comprehensive review of the title insurance industry

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30	prior to authorizing any substantive alterations to the
31	regulatory scheme, delivery of the product, or rules affecting
32	the conduct of the industry, NOW, THEREFORE,
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34	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
35	
36	Section 1. (1) This act may be cited as the "Florida 2008
37	Title Insurance Study Advisory Council Act."
38	(2) The purpose of this act is to create an advisory
39	council to undertake a comprehensive examination of the title
40	insurance delivery system of this state with the ultimate goal of
41	making recommendations for legislation to promote a sound and
42	stable system to promote the safety of real property transfers in
43	this state.
44	(3) The Florida 2008 Title Insurance Study Advisory Council
45	is created. The council shall consist of the following 23
46	members:
47	(a) The Lieutenant Governor or the Lieutenant Governor's
48	designee. The Lieutenant Governor shall serve as chair of the
49	council.
50	(b) The Chief Financial Officer or the Chief Financial
51	Officer's designee. The Chief Financial Officer shall serve as
52	vice chair of the council.
53	(c) One member of the Senate appointed by the President of
54	Senate.
55	(d) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by
56	the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
57	(e) The Insurance Consumer Advocate appointed pursuant to
58	s. 627.0613, Florida Statutes.

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59	(f) The Commissioner of Insurance Regulation.							
60	(g) The Secretary of Business and Professional Regulation.							
61	(h) Four representatives of title insurers doing business							
62	in the state from four different title insurers appointed by the							
63	President of the Senate. No more than one representative may be							
64	named from each affiliated group of corporations as defined in s.							
65	624.509(5)(a)2., Florida Statutes. Such appointments shall not							
66	overlap with those insurer appointments made under paragraph (i).							
67	(i) Four representatives of title insurers doing business							
68	in the state from four different title insurers appointed by the							
69	Speaker of the House of Representatives. No more than one							
70	representative may be named from each affiliated group of							
71	corporations as defined in s. 624.509(5)(a)2., Florida Statutes.							
72	Such appointments shall not overlap with those insurer							
73	appointments made under paragraph (h).							
74	(j) Three independent licensed title insurance agents							
75	appointed by the President of the Senate.							
76	(k) Three independent licensed title insurance agents							
77	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.							
78	(1) Two members of the Real Property, Probate and Trust Law							
79	Section of The Florida Bar who are practicing real estate							
80	attorneys not employed by a title insurer. The designation of							
81	such members shall be made by the Real Property, Probate and							
82	Trust Law Section of The Florida Bar.							
83	(4) The council shall be administratively supported by the							
84	staff of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor. The Department of							
85	Financial Services, the Office of Insurance Regulation, and other							
86	agencies of the state, as well as staff of the applicable							
87	legislative committees, shall supply any information, assistance,							

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88	and facilities that are deemed necessary by the council to carry							
89	out its duties.							
90	(5) The council shall undertake a comprehensive examination							
91	of the title insurance delivery system in this state and shall							
92	include in its study consideration of:							
93	(a) The historical development of the title insurance							
94	industry in this state and its uniqueness among other lines of							
95	insurance.							
96	(b) The current regulatory structure under which oversight							
97	responsibility is shared between different state agencies.							
98	(c) The adequacy of funds and agency personnel to exercise							
99	regulatory oversight.							
100	(d) The adequacy of current mechanisms and expertise to							
101	gather meaningful data to properly evaluate and adopt title							
102	insurance rates.							
103	(e) Such other topics as the council deems necessary to							
104	conduct a thorough examination of the title insurance industry.							
105	(6) The council, at the direction of the chair, may invite							
106	independent actuaries with title insurance expertise to provide							
107	information and appear before the council to aid in performing							
108	its duties.							
109	(7) The council shall hold its initial meeting no later							
110	than August 1, 2008, in Tallahassee. Staff for the council chair							
111	shall schedule and organize the initial meeting. Subsequent							
112	meetings of the council must be held in Tallahassee according to							
113	a schedule developed by the chair.							
114	(8) The council shall submit a final report, setting forth							
115	findings and specific legislative recommendations, to the							
116	Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the							

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117	House	of	Representatives	on	or	before	December	31,	2009.	The
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- 118 <u>council shall terminate after submitting its final report but not</u>
- 119 later than December 31, 2009.
- 120 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
