2	An act relating to title insurance; creating the Florida
3	2008 Title Insurance Study Advisory Council; providing for
4	membership; providing for administrative support for the
5	council; providing responsibilities of the council;
6	authorizing the council to invite independent actuaries to
7	provide certain information; requiring the Office of
8	Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability to
9	conduct a review and report to the council; requiring that
10	the report be submitted to the council by a certain date;
11	providing council meeting requirements; requiring the
12	council to file a report with the Governor and the
13	Legislature; providing for termination of the council;
14	providing an effective date.

16	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that a stable and efficient
17	title insurance delivery system is necessary to promote the
18	economic well-being of the residents of Florida, and
19	WHEREAS, Florida consumers have a right to effective and
20	affordable title insurance, and
21	WHEREAS, title insurance is essential to ensure homeowners
22	and landowners of the safety of real estate transfers in Florida,
23	and
24	WHEREAS, investors and lienholders require the security
25	accorded their business interests by a financially stable and
26	regulated title insurance industry, and
27	WHEREAS, a viable title insurance delivery system requires

efficient and comprehensive state oversight to regulate insurer and agent solvency, education, licensing, and discipline and the

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30	establishment of nondiscriminatory title insurance rates and
31	forms, and
32	WHEREAS, it is the express intent of the Legislature to
33	conduct a comprehensive review of the title insurance industry,
34	the current regulatory scheme, and the rules affecting the
35	conduct of the industry, NOW, THEREFORE,
36	
37	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
38	
39	Section 1. (1) This act may be cited as the "Florida 2008
40	Title Insurance Study Advisory Council Act."
41	(2) The purpose of this act is to create an advisory
42	council to undertake a comprehensive examination of the title
43	insurance delivery system of this state with the ultimate goal of
44	making recommendations for legislation to promote a sound and
45	stable system to promote the safety of real property transfers in
46	this state.
47	(3) The Florida 2008 Title Insurance Study Advisory Council
48	is created. The council shall consist of the following 19
49	members:
50	(a) The Governor or the Governor's designee, who shall
51	serve as chair of the council.
52	(b) The Chief Financial Officer or the Chief Financial
53	Officer's designee, who shall serve as vice chair of the council.
54	(c) One member of the Senate appointed by the President of
55	the Senate.
56	(d) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by
57	the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
58	(e) The Insurance Consumer Advocate appointed pursuant to

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59	s. 627.0613, Florida Statutes.
60	(f) The Commissioner of Insurance Regulation or the
61	commissioner's designee.
62	(g) The Secretary of Business and Professional Regulation
63	or the secretary's designee.
64	(h) Three representatives of title insurers doing business
65	in the state from four different title insurers, appointed by the
66	President of the Senate. No more than one representative may be
67	named from each affiliated group of corporations as defined in s.
68	624.509(5)(a)2., Florida Statutes. Such appointments may not
69	overlap with those insurer appointments made under paragraph (i).
70	(i) Four representatives of title insurers doing business
71	in the state from four different title insurers, appointed by the
72	Speaker of the House of Representatives. No more than one
73	representative may be named from each affiliated group of
74	corporations as defined in s. 624.509(5)(a)2., Florida Statutes.
75	Such appointments may not overlap with those insurer appointments
76	made under paragraph (h).
77	(j) Two independent licensed title insurance agents
78	appointed by the President of the Senate from a list of three
79	agents submitted by the Florida Land Title Association.
80	(k) One independent licensed title insurance agent
81	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives from a
82	list of three agents submitted by the Florida Land Title
83	Association.
84	(1) Two members of the Real Property, Probate and Trust Law
85	Section of The Florida Bar who are practicing real estate
86	attorneys not employed by a title insurer. The designation of
87	such members shall be made by the Real Property, Probate and

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88	Trust Law Section of The Florida Bar.
89	(4) The council shall be administratively supported by the
90	staff of the Executive Office of the Governor. The Department of
91	Financial Services, the Office of Insurance Regulation, and other
92	agencies of the state, as well as staff of the applicable
93	legislative committees, shall supply any information, assistance,
94	and facilities that are deemed necessary by the council to carry
95	out its duties.
96	(5) The council shall undertake a comprehensive examination
97	of the title insurance delivery system in this state and shall
98	include in its study consideration of:
99	(a) The historical development of the title insurance
100	industry in this state and its uniqueness among other lines of
101	insurance.
102	(b) The current regulatory structure under which oversight
103	responsibility is shared among different state agencies.
104	(c) The adequacy of funds and agency personnel to exercise
105	regulatory oversight.
106	(d) The adequacy of current mechanisms and expertise to
107	gather meaningful data to properly evaluate and adopt title
108	insurance rates.
109	(e) Such other topics as the council deems necessary to
110	conduct a thorough examination of the title insurance industry.
111	(6) The council, at the direction of the chair, may invite
112	independent actuaries who have expertise in title insurance to
113	provide information and appear before the council to aid in
114	performing its duties. In order to assist the council, the Office
115	of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability shall
116	conduct an independent review of the historical development of

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117 the title insurance industry in this state and the current 118 fragmented regulatory framework and shall report its findings to 119 the council. Such report shall be submitted to the council by 120 September 30, 2008. 121 The council shall hold its initial meeting no later (7) 122 than August 1, 2008, in Tallahassee. Staff for the council chair 123 shall schedule and organize the initial meeting. Subsequent 124 meetings of the council must be held in Tallahassee according to 125 a schedule developed by the chair. 126 (8) The council shall submit a final report, setting forth 127 findings and specific legislative recommendations, to the 128 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the 129 House of Representatives on or before December 31, 2009. The

130 council shall terminate after submitting its final report but not 131 later than December 31, 2009.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
