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17	Section 1. Section 383.04, Florida Statutes, is amended to

19	383.04 Prophylactic required for eyes of infants
20	(1) Every physician, midwife, or other person in attendance
21	at the birth of a child in the state <u>shall</u> is required to instill
22	or have instilled into the eyes of the baby within 1 hour after
23	birth an effective prophylactic recommended by the Committee on
24	Infectious Diseases of the American Academy of Pediatrics for the
25	prevention of neonatal ophthalmia.
26	(2) Each child born in a hospital in the state must, before
27	being discharged from the hospital, receive an eye examination
28	using an opthalmoscope and dilation of the pupils for detection
29	of pediatric congenital and ocular abnormalities.

(b) As used in this subsection, the term "child health supervision services" means physician-delivered or physiciansupervised services that include, at a minimum, services delivered at the intervals and scope stated in this subsection.

Child health supervision services must include periodic 76 visits that which shall include a history; - a physical 77 examination; τ a developmental assessment and anticipatory 78 guidance;, and appropriate immunizations and laboratory tests; 79 and eye examinations at birth, at 6 to 8 weeks of age, and at 6 80 to 9 months of age, using an opthalmoscope and dilation of the 81 pupils for detection of pediatric congenital and ocular 82 abnormalities and developmental abnormalities.
