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7 (2) The Dale Hickam Excellent Teaching Program is created 8 to provide categorical funding for monetary incentives and 9 bonuses for teaching excellence. The monetary incentives and bonuses may be provided for initial certification for up to one 10 11 10-year period. The Department of Education shall distribute to 12 each school district or to the NBPTS an amount as prescribed annually by the Legislature for the Dale Hickam Excellent 13 14 Teaching Program. For purposes of this section, the Florida 15 School for the Deaf and the Blind shall be considered a school 16 district. Unless otherwise provided in the General Appropriations



Act, each distribution shall be the sum of the amounts earned for the following incentives and bonuses:

19 (a) A fee subsidy to be paid by the Department of Education 20 to the NBPTS on behalf of each individual who is an employee of a 21 district school board or a public school within the school 22 district, who is certified by the district to have demonstrated satisfactory teaching performance pursuant to s. 1012.34 and who 23 satisfies the prerequisites for participating in the NBPTS 24 25 certification program, and who agrees, in writing, to pay 10 26 percent of the NBPTS participation fee and to participate in the 27 NBPTS certification program during the school year for which the 28 fee subsidy is provided. The fee subsidy for each eligible 29 participant shall be an amount equal to 90 percent of the fee 30 charged for participating in the NBPTS certification program. The 31 fee subsidy is a one-time award and may not be duplicated for any individual. 32

33 (b) A portfolio-preparation incentive of \$150 paid by the 34 Department of Education to each teacher employed by a district 35 school board or a public school within a school district who is 36 participating in the NBPTS certification program. The portfolio-37 preparation incentive is a one-time award paid during the school 38 year for which the NBPTS fee subsidy is provided.

39 (a) (c) An annual bonus equal to 10 percent of the prior fiscal year's statewide average salary for classroom teachers to 40 41 be distributed to the school district to be paid to each 42 individual who holds NBPTS certification and is employed by the district school board or by a public school within the school 43 district. The district school board shall distribute the annual 44 45 bonus to each individual who meets the requirements of this paragraph and who is certified annually by the district to have 46

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demonstrated satisfactory teaching performance pursuant to s.
1012.34. The annual bonus may be paid as a single payment or
divided into not more than three payments.

(b) (d) An annual bonus equal to 10 percent of the prior 50 51 fiscal year's statewide average salary for classroom teachers to 52 be distributed to the school district to be paid to each 53 individual who meets the requirements of paragraph (a) (c) and 54 agrees, in writing, to provide the equivalent of 12 workdays of 55 mentoring and related services to public school teachers within 56 the state who do not hold NBPTS certification. Related services 57 must include instruction in helping teachers work more 58 effectively with the families of their students. The district 59 school board shall distribute the annual bonus in a single payment following the completion of all required mentoring and 60 related services for the year. It is not the intent of the 61 Legislature to remove excellent teachers from their assigned 62 63 classrooms; therefore, credit may not be granted by a school district or public school for mentoring or related services 64 65 provided during student contact time during the 196 days of required service for the school year. 66

67 <u>(c) (e)</u> The employer's share of social security and Medicare 68 taxes and Florida Retirement System contributions for those 69 teachers who qualify for NBPTS certification and receive bonus 70 amounts.

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A teacher for whom the state <u>or the school district</u> pays the certification fee and who does not complete the certification program or does not teach in a public school of this state for at least 1 year after completing the certification program must repay the amount of the certification fee to the state. However,

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77 a teacher who completes the certification program but fails to be 78 awarded NBPTS certification is not required to repay the amount 79 of the certification fee if the teacher meets the 1-year teaching 80 requirement. Repayment is not required of a teacher who does not 81 complete the certification program or fails to fulfill the 82 teaching requirement because of the teacher's death or disability or because of other extenuating circumstances as determined by 83 the State Board of Education. 84

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(3) A school district may pay the following:

86 (a) A fee subsidy to the NBPTS on behalf of each individual 87 who is an employee of a district school board or a public school within the school district, who is certified by the district to 88 89 have demonstrated satisfactory teaching performance pursuant to 90 s. 1012.34, who satisfies the prerequisites for participating in 91 the NBPTS certification program, and who agrees, in writing, to pay at least 10 percent or more of the NBPTS participation fee 92 93 and to participate in the NBPTS certification program during the school year for which the fee subsidy is provided. The fee 94 95 subsidy for each eligible participant shall be an amount up to 90 96 percent of the fee charged for participating in the NBPTS certification program. The fee subsidy is a one-time award and 97 98 may not be duplicated for any individual.

99 (b) A portfolio-preparation incentive of up to \$150 to each
 100 teacher employed by a district school board or a public school
 101 within a school district who is participating in the NBPTS
 102 certification program. The portfolio-preparation incentive is a
 103 one-time award paid during the school year for which the NBPTS
 104 fee subsidy is provided.

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105	(c) The employer's share of Florida Retirement System

108	(6) (5) If the funds available in any fiscal year are
109	insufficient to pay in full the annual bonuses for certification
110	and for providing mentoring and related services, such payments
111	for mentoring and related services shall be prorated among the
112	eligible recipients. If the mentoring and related services are
113	prorated, school districts may pay a portion or all of the
114	balance. If funds are insufficient to pay in full the annual
115	bonuses for certification, payments of bonuses for certification
116	shall be prorated among the eligible recipients.
