Between line(s) 57 and 58,

insert:

Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 916.302, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

916.302 Involuntary commitment of defendant determined to be incompetent to proceed. --

- (2) ADMISSION TO A FACILITY. --
- A defendant who has been charged with a felony and who (a) is found to be incompetent to proceed due to retardation or autism, and who meets the criteria for involuntary commitment to the agency under the provisions of this chapter, shall be committed to the agency, and the agency shall retain and provide appropriate training for the defendant. Within No later than 6



months after the date of admission or at the end of any period of extended commitment or at any time the administrator or designee shall have determined that the defendant has regained competency to proceed or no longer meets the criteria for continued commitment, the administrator or designee shall file a report with the court pursuant to this chapter and the applicable Florida Rules of Criminal Procedure. The sheriff shall transport the defendant to the county jail within 15 days after the court receives the report from the agency declaring that the defendant is competent to proceed or no longer meets the criteria for continued commitment. A competency hearing must be held within 30 days after the court receives the report.
