I. Summary:

This bill re-creates the Agency for Persons with Disabilities Administrative Trust Fund, FLAIR #67-2-021, without modification effective July 1, 2008. This fund was created effective July 1, 2005, by chapter 2005-21, Laws of Florida.

This bill amends section 20.1971, Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Section 19(f), Article III of the State Constitution requires that every trust fund be created or recreated by a three-fifths vote of the membership in each house of the Legislature in a separate bill for the sole purpose of creating that trust fund. The Constitution also provides that all newly created trust funds terminate not more than four years after the initial creation unless re-created.

The fund consists of federal matching funds provided for the administration of Medicaid services. Funds are used to support the agency's administration of Medicaid programs and for other purposes pursuant to legislative appropriation.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification and repeals the termination date.

Provides for an effective date of July 1, 2008.
