19 (b) Except as provided in s. 775.16, a person whose civil rights have been restored shall not be disgualified to practice, 20 pursue, or engage in any occupation, trade, vocation, 21 22 profession, or business for which a license, permit, or certificate is required to be issued by the state, any of its 23 24 agencies or political subdivisions, or any municipality solely because of a prior conviction for a crime. However, a person 25 whose civil rights have been restored may be denied a license, 26 27 permit, or certification to pursue, practice, or engage in an occupation, trade, vocation, profession, or business by reason 28 29 of the prior conviction for a crime if the crime was a felony or first degree misdemeanor and directly related to or relevant to 30 the standards normally associated with, or determined by the 31 regulatory authority to be necessary for, the protection of the 32 public or other parties with relationships with the specific 33 occupation, trade, vocation, profession, or business for which 34 the license, permit, or certificate is sought. 35

36 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the status of (C) a person's civil rights may not be considered a disqualification 37 or grounds for denial of a license, permit, or certificate or 38 39 public employment. A person is not required to secure the restoration of his or her civil rights or to prove that his or 40 her civil rights have been restored in order to be considered 41 for a license, permit, or certificate or to be considered for 42 public employment. However, this paragraph does not apply to the 43

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issuance of a license for a concealed weapon or firearm or the 44 45 purchasing of a firearm pursuant to chapter 790. 46 (2)(a) This section does shall not apply be applicable to any law enforcement or correctional agency. 47 This section does shall not apply be applicable to the 48 (b) 49 employment practices of any fire department relating to the hiring of firefighters. An applicant for employment with any 50 fire department who has with a prior felony conviction shall be 51 excluded from employment for a period of 4 years after 52 expiration of sentence or final release by the Parole Commission 53 unless the applicant, prior to the expiration of the 4-year 54 55 period, has received a full pardon or has had his or her civil 56 rights restored. This section does shall not apply be applicable to the 57 (C)58 employment practices of any county or municipality relating to the hiring of personnel for positions deemed to be critical to 59 60 security or public safety pursuant to ss. 125.5801 and 166.0442.
