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21	Section 1. Present subsections (10), (11), (12), and (13)
22	of section 119.011, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as
23	subsections (11), (12), (13), and (14), respectively, and a new
24	subsection (10) is added to that section. to read:

28	Section 2. Paragraph (h) is added to subsection (5) of
29	section 119.071, Florida Statutes, to read:
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30	119.071 General exemptions from inspection or copying of
31	public records
32	(5) OTHER PERSONAL INFORMATION
33	(h)1. Personal identifying information of an applicant for
34	or a recipient of paratransit services which is held by an agency
35	is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I
36	of the State Constitution.
37	2. This exemption applies to personal identifying
38	information of an applicant for or a recipient of paratransit
39	services which is held by an agency before, on, or after the
40	effective date of this exemption.
41	3. Confidential and exempt personal identifying information
42	shall be disclosed:
43	a. With the express written consent of the individual or
44	the individual's legally authorized representative;
45	b. In a medical emergency, but only to the extent that is
46	necessary to protect the health or life of the individual;
47	c. By court order upon a showing of good cause; or
48	d. To another agency in the performance of its duties and
49	responsibilities.
50	4. This paragraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset
51	Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed
52	on October 2, 2013, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through
53	reenactment by the Legislature.
54	Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 119.0713, Florida
55	Statutes, is repealed.
56	Section 4. The Legislature finds that it is a public
57	necessity that personal identifying information of an applicant
58	for or recipient of paratransit services be held confidential and

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59	exempt in order to protect health-related information concerning
60	individuals which is of a sensitive and personal nature. Matters
61	of personal health care traditionally are private and
62	confidential concerns between the agency contracting for
63	services, the service provider, and the patient. The private and
64	confidential nature of personal health matters pervades both the
65	public and private health care sectors. For these reasons, the
66	individual's expectation of and right to privacy in all matters
67	regarding his or her personal health and eligibility for and
68	receipt of paratransit services or eligibility for and receipt of
69	services under the transportation disadvantaged program which are
70	provided by an agency or its service providers necessitates this
71	exemption.
72	Section 5. Section 2 of chapter 2003-110, Laws of Florida
73	is repealed.
74	Section 6. Subsection (1) of section 257.34, Florida
75	Statutes, is amended to read:
76	257.34 Florida International Archive and Repository
77	(1) There is created within the Division of Library and
78	Information Services of the Department of State the Florida
79	International Archive and Repository for the preservation of
80	those public records, as defined in <u>s. 119.011</u> s . 119.011(11) ,
81	manuscripts, international judgments involving disputes between
82	domestic and foreign businesses, and all other public matters
83	that the department or the Florida Council of International
84	Development deems relevant to international issues. It is the
85	duty and responsibility of the division to:
86	(a) Organize and administer the Florida International
87	Archive and Repository.

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(b) Preserve and administer records that are transferred to its custody; accept, arrange, and preserve them, according to approved archival and repository practices; and permit them, at reasonable times and under the supervision of the division, to be inspected and copied. All public records transferred to the custody of the division are subject to the provisions of s. 119.07(1).

97 (d) Cooperate with and assist, insofar as practicable,
98 state institutions, departments, agencies, counties,
99 municipalities, and individuals engaged in internationally

(e) Provide a public research room where, under rules
established by the division, the materials in the international
archive and repository may be studied.

(f) Conduct, promote, and encourage research in international trade, government, and culture and maintain a program of information, assistance, coordination, and guidance for public officials, educational institutions, libraries, the scholarly community, and the general public engaged in such research.

(g) Cooperate with and, insofar as practicable, assist agencies, libraries, institutions, and individuals in projects concerned with internationally related issues and preserve original materials relating to internationally related issues.

(h) Assist and cooperate with the records and information management program in the training and information program described in s. 257.36(1)(g).

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Section 7. Subsection (1) of section 257.35, FloridaStatutes, is amended to read:

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257.35 Florida State Archives.--

There is created within the Division of Library and 120 (1)121 Information Services of the Department of State the Florida State 122 Archives for the preservation of those public records, as defined 123 in s. 119.011 s. 119.011(11), manuscripts, and other archival 124 material that have been determined by the division to have 125 sufficient historical or other value to warrant their continued 126 preservation and have been accepted by the division for deposit 127 in its custody. It is the duty and responsibility of the division 128 to:

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(a) Organize and administer the Florida State Archives.

Preserve and administer such records as shall be 130 (b) 131 transferred to its custody; accept, arrange, and preserve them, 132 according to approved archival practices; and permit them, at 133 reasonable times and under the supervision of the division, to be 134 inspected and copied. All public records transferred to the 135 custody of the division shall be subject to the provisions of s. 136 119.07(1), except that any public record or other record provided 137 by law to be confidential or prohibited from inspection by the 138 public shall be made accessible only after a period of 50 years 139 from the date of the creation of the record. Any nonpublic 140 manuscript or other archival material which is placed in the 141 keeping of the division under special terms and conditions, shall 142 be made accessible only in accordance with such law terms and 143 conditions and shall be exempt from the provisions of s. 144 119.07(1) to the extent necessary to meet the terms and conditions for a nonpublic manuscript or other archival material. 145

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146 (c) Assist the records and information management program147 in the determination of retention values for records.

(d) Cooperate with and assist insofar as practicable state
institutions, departments, agencies, counties, municipalities,
and individuals engaged in activities in the field of state
archives, manuscripts, and history and accept from any person any
paper, book, record, or similar material which in the judgment of
the division warrants preservation in the state archives.

(e) Provide a public research room where, under rules
established by the division, the materials in the state archives
may be studied.

(f) Conduct, promote, and encourage research in Florida history, government, and culture and maintain a program of information, assistance, coordination, and guidance for public officials, educational institutions, libraries, the scholarly community, and the general public engaged in such research.

(g) Cooperate with and, insofar as practicable, assist agencies, libraries, institutions, and individuals in projects designed to preserve original source materials relating to Florida history, government, and culture and prepare and publish handbooks, guides, indexes, and other literature directed toward encouraging the preservation and use of the state's documentary resources.

(h) Encourage and initiate efforts to preserve, collect,
process, transcribe, index, and research the oral history of
Florida government.

(i) Assist and cooperate with the records and information
management program in the training and information program
described in s. 257.36(1)(g).
