An act for the relief of Dennis Gay and Diana Gay; providing an appropriation to compensate Dennis Gay and Diana Gay for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the Department of Transportation; providing for the use of funds; providing for the reversion of funds to the state; providing a limitation on the total amount paid for attorney's fees, lobbying fees, costs, and other similar expenses relating to the claim; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, on February 2, 2005, at approximately 7 a.m., Dennis Gay, a 58-year-old man, was a pedestrian in the crosswalk of Brorein Street in Tampa when he was struck by a Department of Transportation vehicle, and

WHEREAS, upon being struck by the vehicle, Dennis Gay was thrown approximately 27 feet and rendered unconscious, and

WHEREAS, Dennis Gay was taken by ambulance to Tampa General Hospital and was admitted to the hospital in critical condition, diagnosed as having a skull fracture, subarachnoid hemorrhage, subdural hematoma, intracerebral hemorrhage, and left hemiparesis, and

WHEREAS, the primary neurosurgeon attending to Dennis Gay induced a coma to try and control the swelling in Dennis Gay's brain, and

WHEREAS, Dennis Gay was objectively diagnosed by computer tomography imaging as having significant brain bleeding, which left him permanently brain-damaged and suffering from impaired

cognitive functioning and loss of emotional control, and

WHEREAS, the neuropsychologist hired by the Department of

Transportation to examine Dennis Gay concurred in the finding of

permanent brain damage, and

WHEREAS, upon discharge from the hospital several months later in April 2005, Dennis Gay exhibited goal-directed behavior only if cued, was able to relearn old skills such as activities of daily living, though memory loss interfered with new learning, had a beginning awareness of self and others, suffered cognitive difficulties and struggled with ambulation, and was unable to negotiate the entry stairs at his home, thus requiring ramp modifications to the premises, and

WHEREAS, Diana Gay, Dennis Gay's wife of 35 years, is left with the care and custody of a significantly disabled man who looks like her husband but no longer acts like her husband, and

WHEREAS, Dennis and Diana Gay filed a lawsuit against the Department of Transportation seeking compensation for injuries and damages sustained, and

WHEREAS, there is no dispute as to the liability of the Department of Transportation, and the department has submitted to a consent judgment in the amount of \$900,000, with Dennis Gay to receive \$600,000 and Diana Gay to receive \$300,000, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has paid \$100,000 to each claimant pursuant to the limits of liability set forth in s. 768.28, Florida Statutes, and payment of the remaining amount is conditioned upon the passage of a claim bill by the Legislature in the amount of \$700,000, of which \$500,000 is to be placed in a special needs trust created for the benefit of

Dennis Gay and \$200,000 is to be paid to Diana Gay, NOW,
THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this act are found and declared to be true.

Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Transportation the sum of \$500,000 for the relief of Dennis Gay as compensation for injuries and damages sustained. The funds awarded under this section shall be placed in a special needs trust created for the use and benefit of Dennis Gay. Any funds remaining in the trust upon the death of Dennis Gay shall revert to the General Revenue Fund of the State of Florida.

Section 3. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to draw a warrant in favor of Dennis Gay in the sum of \$500,000 upon funds in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation, and the Chief Financial Officer is directed to pay the same out of such funds in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Section 4. There is appropriated from the General Revenue
Fund to the Department of Transportation the sum of \$200,000 for
the relief of Diana Gay as compensation for injuries and damages
sustained.

Section 5. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to draw a warrant in favor of Diana Gay in the sum of \$200,000 upon funds in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of

Transportation, and the Chief Financial Officer is directed to pay the same out of such funds in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Section 6. Any amount paid by the Department of
Transportation pursuant to the waiver of sovereign immunity
permitted under s. 768.28, Florida Statutes, and the award under
this act are intended to provide the sole compensation for all
present and future claims arising out of the factual situation
described in the preamble to this act which resulted in injuries
and damages to Dennis Gay and Diana Gay. The total amount paid
for attorney's fees, lobbying fees, costs, and other similar
expenses relating to this claim may not exceed 25 percent of the
amount awarded under sections 2 and 4 of this act.

Section 7. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
