Senate House

Senators Bennett, Rich, King, Dockery, Deutch, Margolis, and Joyner moved the following substitute for amendment (386098):

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete lines 72 through 341 and insert:

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- The probable gestational age of the fetus at the time the termination of pregnancy is to be performed.
- The medical risks to the woman and fetus of carrying the pregnancy to term.
- Printed materials prepared and provided by the department have been provided to the pregnant woman, if she chooses to view these materials, including:
 - a. A description of the fetus.
- A list of agencies that offer alternatives to terminating the pregnancy.

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- Detailed information on the availability of medical assistance benefits for prenatal care, childbirth, and neonatal care.
- The woman acknowledges in writing, before the termination of pregnancy, that the information required to be provided under this subsection has been provided.

Nothing in this paragraph is intended to prohibit a physician from providing any additional information which the physician deems material to the woman's informed decision to terminate her pregnancy.

- (b) In the event a medical emergency exists and a physician cannot comply with the requirements for informed consent, a physician may terminate a pregnancy if he or she has obtained at least one corroborative medical opinion attesting to the medical necessity for emergency medical procedures and to the fact that to a reasonable degree of medical certainty the continuation of the pregnancy would threaten the life of the pregnant woman. In the event no second physician is available for a corroborating opinion, the physician may proceed but shall document reasons for the medical necessity in the patient's medical records.
- (c) If an ultrasound is performed at any time before an abortion is performed or the physician or health care professional working in conjunction with the physician determines that an ultrasound will be performed as part of the abortion procedure, such physician or health care professional working in conjunction with the physician shall offer the woman the opportunity to view a live ultrasound image and, upon the request of the woman, contemporaneously review and explain the live ultrasound images.

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- 1. The ultrasound must be performed by the physician who is to perform the abortion or by a health care professional under such physician's supervision.
- The woman has the right to decline to view the ultrasound images after she is informed of her right and offered the opportunity to view such ultrasound images.
- 3. The requirements in this paragraph must be performed at no additional charge to the pregnant woman.

This paragraph does not apply if the woman is a victim of rape or incest or if the woman has been diagnosed as having a condition that, on the basis of the physician's good faith clinical judgment, so threatens the health or life of the pregnant woman as to necessitate the immediate termination of her pregnancy.

(d) (c) Violation of this subsection by a physician constitutes grounds for disciplinary action under s. 458.331 or s. 459.015. Substantial compliance or reasonable belief that complying with the requirements of informed consent would threaten the life or health of the patient is a defense to any action brought under this paragraph.

Delete lines 3 through 35 and insert:

> requiring a physician or health care professional to offer a pregnant woman the opportunity to view a live ultrasound image and, upon request, review and explain the images under certain circumstances; requiring that the ultrasound

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be performed by the physician or health care professional who will perform the abortion; providing for the right to decline an opportunity to view the ultrasound images; requiring that the services be performed at no additional charge; providing an exception if the woman is a victim of rape or incest or has been diagnosed as having a condition that necessitates the immediate termination of the pregnancy; providing for severability; providing
