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The Committee on Governmental Operations (Lawson) recommended the following **amendment**:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. Section 409.942, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

409.942 Electronic benefit transfer program.--

The Department of Children and Family Services shall 10 (1)establish an electronic benefit transfer program for the 11 12 dissemination of food stamp benefits and temporary assistance payments, including refugee cash assistance payments, asylum 13 14 applicant payments, and child support disregard payments. If 15 the Federal Government does not enact legislation or regulations providing for dissemination of supplemental 16 security income by electronic benefit transfer, the state may 17

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18 include supplemental security income in the electronic benefit 19 transfer program.

20 (a) (2) The department shall, in accordance with 21 applicable federal laws and regulations, develop minimum 22 program requirements and other policy initiatives for the 23 electronic benefit transfer program.

24 <u>(b) (3)</u> The department shall enter into public-private 25 contracts for all provisions of electronic transfer of public 26 assistance benefits.

27 (2) (4) Workforce Florida, Inc., through the Agency for Workforce Innovation, shall establish an electronic benefit 28 29 transfer program for the use and management of education, 30 training, child care, transportation, and other program benefits under its direction. The workforce electronic benefit 31 transfer program shall fulfill all federal and state 32 requirements for Individual Training Accounts, Retention 33 34 Incentive Training Accounts, Individual Development Accounts, and Individual Services Accounts. The workforce electronic 35 36 benefit transfer program shall be designed to enable an individual who receives an electronic benefit transfer card 37 under subsection (1) to use that card for purposes of benefits 38 provided under the workforce development system as well. The 39 40 Department of Children and Family Services shall assist 41 Workforce Florida, Inc., in developing an electronic benefit 42 transfer program for the workforce development system that is fully compatible with the department's electronic benefit 43 transfer program. The agency shall reimburse the department for 44 45 all costs incurred in providing such assistance and shall pay all costs for the development of the workforce electronic 46 47 benefit transfer program.

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48	(3) By July 1, 2010, the Department of Health shall
49	establish a statewide electronic benefit transfer program for the
50	dissemination of benefits under the "Special Supplemental
51	Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children," or WIC,
52	authorized by the Child Nutrition Act of 1966, as amended.

56	card for purposes of benefits provided under the WIC program.
57	(b) The Department of Children and Family Services shall
58	assist the Department of Health in developing an electronic
59	benefit transfer program for the WIC program system which is
60	fully compatible with the electronic benefit transfer programs
61	operated by the Department of Children and Family Services and
62	Workforce Florida, Inc. The Department of Health shall reimburse
63	the Department of Children and Family Services for all costs
64	incurred in providing such assistance and shall pay all costs of
65	the development of the WIC electronic benefit transfer program.
66	Section 2. Subsection (3) is added to section 383.011,
67	Florida Statutes, to read:
68	383.011 Administration of maternal and child health

70	(3) In administering the WIC program, the Department of
71	Health:
72	(a) For purposes of meeting the federal cost neutrality
73	requirement of Title 7, part 246 of the Code of Federal
74	Regulations, shall compare the average cost of each food item
75	redeemed by above-50-percent vendors against the average cost of
76	the same food item redeemed by regular vendors. The department
77	shall collect individual food item redemption costs by requiring
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78	authorized vendors to record the price of each redeemed item on
79	the WIC voucher.
80	(b) Shall not discontinue a WIC-eligible generic product
81	unless the product no longer meets the nutritional guidelines of
82	the WIC program.
83	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

101	cost of certain food items and collect individual food
102	item redemption costs; prohibiting the Department of
103	Health from discontinuing a WIC-eligible generic product;
104	providing an exception; providing an effective date.

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
