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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to maternal and child health programs; amending s. 409.942, F.S.; requiring the Department of Health to submit a plan for the implementation of a electronic benefits transfer program for the dissemination of Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) benefits to the United States Department of Agriculture by a certain date and to establish the program by a certain date; amending s. 383.011, F.S.; requiring the Department of Health to compare the average cost of certain food items and collect individual food item redemption costs; prohibiting the Department of Health from discontinuing a WIC-eligible generic product; providing an exception; requiring that the department expend funds provided by the Federal Government only for administering the program; authorizing the department to submit a budget amendment to the Executive Office of the Governor if the department exceeds the federal funds allocation; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 409.942, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

409.942 Electronic benefit transfer program.--

(1) The Department of Children and Family Services shall establish an electronic benefit transfer program for the dissemination of food stamp benefits and temporary assistance payments, including refugee cash assistance payments, asylum applicant payments, and child support disregard payments. If

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the Federal Government does not enact legislation or regulations providing for dissemination of supplemental security income by electronic benefit transfer, the state may include supplemental security income in the electronic benefit transfer program.

- (a) (2) The department shall, in accordance with applicable federal laws and regulations, develop minimum program requirements and other policy initiatives for the electronic benefit transfer program.
- (b) (3) The department shall enter into public-private contracts for all provisions of electronic transfer of public assistance benefits.
- (2) (4) Workforce Florida, Inc., through the Agency for Workforce Innovation, shall establish an electronic benefit transfer program for the use and management of education, training, child care, transportation, and other program benefits under its direction. The workforce electronic benefit transfer program shall fulfill all federal and state requirements for Individual Training Accounts, Retention Incentive Training Accounts, Individual Development Accounts, and Individual Services Accounts. The workforce electronic benefit transfer program shall be designed to enable an individual who receives an electronic benefit transfer card under subsection (1) to use that card for purposes of benefits provided under the workforce development system as well. The Department of Children and Family Services shall assist Workforce Florida, Inc., in developing an electronic benefit transfer program for the workforce development system that is fully compatible with the department's electronic benefit

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transfer program. The agency shall reimburse the department for all costs incurred in providing such assistance and shall pay all costs for the development of the workforce electronic benefit transfer program.

- (3) The Department of Health shall:
- (a) By January 1, 2009, submit a plan for approval by the United States Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Food and Nutrition Service, for the implementation of a statewide electronic benefits transfer program for the dissemination of benefits under the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), authorized by the Child Nutrition Act. The plan shall be developed in consultation with WIC vendors, including above-50-percent vendors.
- (b) By July 1, 2010, establish a statewide electronic benefit transfer program for the dissemination of benefits under the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), authorized by the Child Nutrition Act. The electronic benefit transfer program shall be implemented in consultation with WIC vendors, including above-50-percent vendors.
- (c) Submit reports to the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate as to progress in obtaining federal approval and establishing a statewide electronic benefit transfer system by January 1, 2009, and by January 1, 2010.
- Section 2. Subsection (3) is added to section 383.011, Florida Statutes, to read:
- 383.011 Administration of maternal and child health programs.--
 - (3) In administering the WIC program, the Department of

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- (a) Upon implementation of an electronic benefit transfer system and for the purposes of meeting the federal cost neutrality requirement of 7 C.F.R. part 246, shall compare the average cost of each food item redeemed by above-50-percent vendors against the average cost of the same food item redeemed by regular vendors.
- (b) May not discontinue a WIC-eligible generic product unless the product no longer meets the nutritional guidelines of the WIC program.
- (c) Shall expend funds provided by the Federal Government only for purposes of administering the program. If the department exceeds the allocation of federal funds, the department may submit a budget amendment to the Executive Office of the Governor requesting additional authority to use state trust fund moneys to implement the program pursuant to s. 216.181(11).
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
