7	(t) Health care clinic establishment permitEffective
8	January 1, 2009, a health care clinic establishment permit is
9	required for the purchase of a prescription drug by a place of
10	business at one general physical location owned and operated by a
11	professional corporation or professional limited liability
12	company described in chapter 621, or a corporation that employs a
13	veterinarian as a qualifying practitioner. For the purpose of
14	this paragraph, the term "qualifying practitioner" means a
15	licensed health care practitioner defined in s. 456.001 or a
16	veterinarian licensed under chapter 474, who is authorized under

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17	the appropriate practice act to prescribe and administer a
18	prescription drug.
19	1. An establishment must provide, as part of the
20	application required under s. 499.012, designation of a
21	qualifying practitioner who will be responsible for complying
22	with all legal and regulatory requirements related to the
23	purchase, recordkeeping, storage, and handling of the
24	prescription drugs. In addition, the designated qualifying
25	practitioner shall be the practitioner whose name, establishment
26	address, and license number is used on all distribution documents
27	for prescription drugs purchased or returned by the health care
28	clinic establishment. Upon initial appointment of a qualifying
29	practitioner, the qualifying practitioner and the health care
30	clinic establishment shall notify the department on a form
31	furnished by the department within 10 days after such employment.
32	In addition, the qualifying practitioner and health care clinic
33	establishment shall notify the department within 10 days after
34	any subsequent change.
35	2. The health care clinic establishment must employ a
36	qualifying practitioner at each establishment.
37	3. In addition to the remedies and penalties provided in
38	this part, a violation of this chapter by the health care clinic
39	establishment or qualifying practitioner constitutes grounds for
40	discipline of the qualifying practitioner by the appropriate
41	regulatory board.
42	4. The purchase of prescription drugs by the health care
43	clinic establishment is prohibited during any period of time when
44	the establishment does not comply with this paragraph.
45	5. A health care clinic establishment permit is not a
46	pharmacy permit or otherwise subject to chapter 465. A health
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47 <u>care clinic establishment that meets the criteria of a modified</u>

- 48 Class II institutional pharmacy under s. 465.019 is not eligible
- 49 to be permitted under this paragraph.

 - 0 <u>6. This paragraph does not prohibit a qualifying</u>
- 51 practitioner from purchasing prescription drugs.
