Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
Section 1. Paragraph (e) is added to subsection (1) of
section 784.07, Florida Statutes, subsection (2) of that section
is amended, and subsection (3) of that section is reenacted, to
read:
784.07 Assault or battery of law enforcement officers,
firefighters, emergency medical care providers, public transit
employees or agents, or other specified officers;
reclassification of offenses; minimum sentences
(1) As used in this section, the term:
(e) "Ocean lifeguard" means a lifeguard employed along the
coastal or intracoastal beaches and shores of the state to help
prevent injury or drowning of persons.
(2) Whenever any person is charged with knowingly
committing an assault or battery upon a law enforcement officer,
a firefighter, an emergency medical care provider, a traffic
accident investigation officer as described in s. 316.640, a

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30 nonsworn law enforcement agency employee who is certified as an 31 agency inspector, blood alcohol analyst, or a breath test 32 operator while such employee is in uniform and engaged in processing, testing, evaluating, analyzing, or transporting a 33 34 person who is detained or under arrest for DUI, a traffic infraction enforcement officer as described in s. 316.640, a 35 parking enforcement specialist as defined in s. 316.640, a person 36 37 licensed as a security officer as defined in s. 493.6101 and 38 wearing a uniform that bears at least one patch or emblem that is 39 visible at all times that clearly identifies the employing agency 40 and that clearly identifies the person as a licensed security 41 officer, or a security officer employed by the board of trustees 42 of a community college, or an ocean lifeguard while the officer, 43 firefighter, emergency medical care provider, intake officer, traffic accident investigation officer, traffic infraction 44 45 enforcement officer, inspector, analyst, operator, parking enforcement specialist, public transit employee or agent, or 46 security officer, or ocean lifeguard is engaged in the lawful 47 48 performance of his or her duties, the offense for which the 49 person is charged shall be reclassified as follows:

50 (a) In the case of assault, from a misdemeanor of the
51 second degree to a misdemeanor of the first degree.

52 (b) In the case of battery, from a misdemeanor of the first53 degree to a felony of the third degree.

(c) In the case of aggravated assault, from a felony of the third degree to a felony of the second degree. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person convicted of aggravated assault upon a law enforcement officer shall be sentenced to a minimum term of imprisonment of 3 years.

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(d) In the case of aggravated battery, from a felony of the second degree to a felony of the first degree. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person convicted of aggravated battery of a law enforcement officer shall be sentenced to a minimum term of imprisonment of 5 years.

64 (3) Any person who is convicted of a battery under
65 paragraph (2)(b) and, during the commission of the offense, such
66 person possessed:

67 (a) A "firearm" or "destructive device" as those terms are
68 defined in s. 790.001, shall be sentenced to a minimum term of
69 imprisonment of 3 years.

(b) A semiautomatic firearm and its high-capacity detachable box magazine, as defined in s. 775.087(3), or a machine gun as defined in s. 790.001, shall be sentenced to a minimum term of imprisonment of 8 years.

Notwithstanding s. 948.01, adjudication of guilt or imposition of sentence shall not be suspended, deferred, or withheld, and the defendant is not eligible for statutory gain-time under s. 944.275 or any form of discretionary early release, other than pardon or executive clemency, or conditional medical release under s. 947.149, prior to serving the minimum sentence.

392 A law enforcement agency may fingerprint and photograph a child 393 taken into custody upon probable cause that such child has committed any other violation of law, as the agency deems 394 395 appropriate. Such fingerprint records and photographs shall be 396 retained by the law enforcement agency in a separate file, and 397 these records and all copies thereof must be marked "Juvenile 398 Confidential." These records are not available for public 399 disclosure and inspection under s. 119.07(1) except as provided 400 in ss. 943.053 and 985.04(2), but shall be available to other law 401 enforcement agencies, criminal justice agencies, state attorneys, 402 the courts, the child, the parents or legal custodians of the 403 child, their attorneys, and any other person authorized by the 404 court to have access to such records. In addition, such records 405 may be submitted to the Department of Law Enforcement for 406 inclusion in the state criminal history records and used by 407 criminal justice agencies for criminal justice purposes. These 408 records may, in the discretion of the court, be open to 409 inspection by anyone upon a showing of cause. The fingerprint and 410 photograph records shall be produced in the court whenever 411 directed by the court. Any photograph taken pursuant to this 412 section may be shown by a law enforcement officer to any victim 413 or witness of a crime for the purpose of identifying the person who committed such crime. 414
