2 An act relating to an electronic monitoring program for 3 tracking lost persons; establishing a grant program to encourage counties to implement county lifesaver programs; 4 describing the components of the program; designating the 5 Department of Law Enforcement as the administrative 6 7 agency; providing for application for state grant funds and requiring local matching funds; providing a cap on the 8 9 amount of a grant and for prioritizing and prorating grants; requiring the county sheriff's office or other 10 lead agency to use the funds for purchasing equipment and 11 training; requiring the solicitation of private moneys and 12 the achievement of financial independence for the program 13 within a specified time; providing an effective date. 14

16 WHEREAS, more than 5 million United States residents have 17 Alzheimer's disease and more than 50 percent of those 18 individuals wander and become lost, and

WHEREAS, autism is the fastest-growing serious developmental disability in the United States and many autistic individuals wander and are attracted to water, causing drowning to be the leading cause of death for children who have autism, and

24 WHEREAS, Project Lifesaver is a search-and-rescue program 25 that can quickly find wandering individuals who have Alzheimer's 26 disease, autism, Down syndrome, or other mental impairments, and 27 WHEREAS, Project Lifesaver was established in Virginia in 28 1999 and has been implemented by law enforcement agencies and Page 1 of 4

| 40 | Section 1. Lifesaver program grants |
| 41 | (1) A state grant program is established to encourage each |
| 42 | county in this state to implement a lifesaver program that is |
| 43 | modeled after Project Lifesaver, a search-and-rescue program |
| 44 | designed to quickly find a lost or wandering person who is |
| 45 | mentally impaired due to Alzheimer's disease, autism, Down |
| 46 | syndrome, or other causes. The program uses small transmitters, |
| 47 | which are usually worn on a participant's wrist, to |
| 48 | electronically track lost or wandering participants. A county |
| 49 | sheriff's office or other lead agency is equipped with receivers |

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2008 57 lead agency must submit an application annually by October 1, 58 which includes: An estimate of the number of people who might qualify 59 (a) 60 for lifesaver assistance; 61 An estimate of the startup cost; (b) 62 A statement of the number of personnel available for (C) 63 tracking lost individuals; and 64 The source or sources and the amount of local funds (d) 65 available for matching state grant moneys. The department shall prioritize the grant moneys in 66 (4) 67 accordance with the respective counties' needs for tracking 68 services, the availability of local sources to provide matching funds, and the date the application was received by the 69 70 department. The maximum grant that a county may receive for startup is \$10,000, and the amount awarded must be matched, 71 72 dollar for dollar, by local funds. Grants awarded to qualifying 73 counties must be prorated in accordance with the availability of 74 state funds. 75 (5) The county sheriff's office or other lead agency shall 76 use the grant money and matching funds to purchase the necessary 77 equipment and training to implement a county lifesaver program. 78 Through its community resource officer, the sheriff's office or 79 other lead agency shall solicit moneys from private sources so 80 as to ensure that within 3 years the lifesaver program is selfsupporting and no longer requires state funding. 81 Section 2. 82 The sum of \$670,000 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Law Enforcement for 83 84 the 2008-2009 fiscal year for the purpose of awarding grants to

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85 counties that qualify under this act to start a county lifesaver 86 program.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
