> An act relating to the opening of public $k$ through 12 schools; amending s. 1001.42, F.S.; providing exceptions to a provision prohibiting a public school from opening earlier than 14 days before Labor Day; providing requirements for the district school board; providing an exception for a school operating on a year-round or extended calendar; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (f) of subsection (4) of section 1001.42, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
1001.42 Powers and duties of district school board.--The district school board, acting as a board, shall exercise all powers and perform all duties listed below:
(4) ESTABLISHMENT, ORGANIZATION, AND OPERATION OF

SCHOOLS.--Adopt and provide for the execution of plans for the establishment, organization, and operation of the schools of the district, including, but not limited to, the following:
(f) Opening and closing of schools; fixing uniform date.--Adopt policies for the opening and closing of schools and fix uniform dates.; Beginning with the 2007-2008 school year except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, the opening date for schools in the district may not be earlier than 14 days before Labor Day each year.

1. A district school board may establish an opening date earlier than 14 days before Labor Day if the school board:

a. Holds at least three public hearings concerning the earlier opening date at different geographic locations throughout the school district;
b. Surveys the parents of all public school students enrolled within the district; and
c. Approves the earlier opening date by a unanimous vote.
2. A school that operates under a year-round school year or an extended calendar shall open and close pursuant to district school board policy and may establish an opening date that is earlier than 14 days before Labor Day.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
